

Mt. Meru Premium Coffee is available in both Regular and Decaf, as Whole Bean, Drip Grind, Perk Grind, in 12oz and 4lb bags, 12 cup single serve portions in fully biodegradable packaging, and popular flavors in 10oz packages, Drip Grind, of French Vanilla, Hazelnut, Butter Pecan, and Chocolate Raspberry.

The Mt. Meru Coffee Project's objectives, - Supporting Families, Changing Lives, and Growing Futures - for the small coffee farmers on the slopes of Mt. Meru has been supported by you, the consumers of the Premium Tanzanian Coffee, since 1999.

The Project is one element within the Global Partnership between the Greater Milwaukee Synod (ELCA) and the Diocese of Meru (ELCT) in northern Tanzania. The Project is built on a combination of fair trading practices and a partnership built on mutual respect. This enables the small coffee farmers to achieve economic stability and escape a cycle of poverty. The Project is about much more than growing, importing, promoting and selling coffee.

Did you know 142 Americans die per day of a drug over dose? America is enduring a death toll equal to September 11th every three weeks. Here in Washington County, WI we have lost over 100 lives since 2011. We are not immune to this public health epidemic. In 2016 alone, 23 people died in Washington County due to opiates or heroin. Between 2009 and 2014, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services reported that Washington County had a higher rate of Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (or addiction) than experienced in Milwaukee County.

The Washington County Heroin Task Force, a program of Elevate Inc., was launched in early 2014 in response to this growing problem. Members of the task force include law enforcement, elected officials, schools, civic groups, healthcare professionals, businesses, and community members. The Task Force identified four specific target areas. These efforts focus on: Prevention; Treatment; Advocacy; Law Enforcement/Courts.

Please join us November 11/12 at all services as we hear from Ron Naab, who will share his personal story of how opiates and heroin have impacted his family. Also Ronna Corliss leads a forum at 10:45 am on the 12th about this growing epidemic in our community and things we can do to make a positive




OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIVING

Fall 2017: "The Apostle's Creed"

This fall, take part in a three-session Gather Bible study on the Apostles' Creed and what we together say we believe. Gather is the magazine of Women of the ELCA.

In "The Apostles' Creed," Bible study author Julia Seymour, pastor at Lutheran Church of Hope, Anchorage, Alaska, writes: "Beyond preferences or even deeply held convictions, the theological underpinnings of a religious community are the structure for teaching, preaching and action. For our life of faith together, creeds are more than just words. They are vessels for carrying one another through doubt, joy and sorrow.

Session 3: I believe in the Holy Spirit

In the Trinity, the Holy Spirit is revealed not through characterization, but through the power of the Spirit in action. How do we understand the communion of saints, forgiveness, resurrection, the church and all that will be, as the revelatory work of the Holy Spirit? As part of the Trinity, the Spirit carries the same weight as the Father and the Son, yet many of us are drawn to one part of the Trinity more than others. How can we use the creed to perceive and honor the Spirit and the Spirit's work?
