Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Adult Forum

On October 30th the church will be celebrating the 500th anniversary of the reformation. As part of our recognition of this during October there will be a series of Adult forums focusing

on Luther's Small Catechism and its impact on us today. **The forums will meet on October 15th, 22nd and 29th after the 9:30 service (about 10:45).** There is a study book for \$14.99 you can purchase in the church office. It is an in depth look at some of the history of the Lutheran tradition and is handsomely illustrated as well. The study book is not necessary for you to join us for the discussion. Come and celebrate 500 years of Lutheran identity as we revisit the faith expressions we experienced in confirmation and continue to experience in our life together.

Book Study

In honor of the 500th anniversary of the reformation the book for October is **Kitty My Rib** by E. Jane Mall. Here is a brief description:

Katharine (Katharina Von Bora) Luther was Martin Luther's better half. She narrowly escaped from the Nimbschen convent, experienced marriage with an unromantic beginning, and later became Luther's beloved "Kitty." She mellowed Luther's harsher side, kept the household from bankruptcy despite her husband's generosity, and enhanced his life with the excitement of family living. With warmth and empathy, the author weaves together historical fact and fascinating insight throughout this novel.

Come and join us for a look at Luther and the reformation from another angle in this work of historical fiction. We will discuss the book on **October 23rd at 1:00 and 7:00.**

Fall 2017: "The Apostle's Creed"

This fall, take part in a three-session Gather Bible study on the Apostles' Creed and what we together say we believe. Gather is the magazine of Women of the ELCA.

In "The Apostles' Creed," Bible study author Julia Seymour, pastor at Lutheran Church of Hope, Anchorage, Alaska, writes: "Beyond preferences or even deeply held convictions, the theological underpinnings of a religious community are the structure for teaching, preaching and action. For our life of faith together, creeds are more than just words. They are vessels for carrying one another through doubt, joy and sorrow.

Session 2: I believe in Jesus Christ

In Scripture, Jesus is called the Messiah, the Son of God, a teacher, a healer, the pioneer of our faith, the rock of our salvation, Son of Man and other titles. In the Apostles' Creed, Jesus' life and ministry is briefly sum up. Jesus is described as God's only Son and our Lord—one who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born by the Virgin, who suffered under Pilate, who was crucified, died and was buried. The creed is a definition of the work of the Father, Son and Spirit, yet there is also fullness to being followers in the Way of Christ that is not described in the creed. How does the creed encompass faithful living in imitation of Christ? In other words, what does it mean to believe even more about Jesus and following Jesus than we say in the words of the creed?
