Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
As I write this letter, I am fresh from participating in a Martin Luther King Jr. celebration at Cedar Ridge. The day was both inspiring and disturbing at the same time.

The celebration consisted of some songs from the civil rights days of the 60's, and some prayers of course. But there were two parts that especially made me take a long time to stop and think.

We read from Dr. King's letter from a jail cell in Birmingham, Alabama. He was responding to statements from white clergymen who said he and those who worked with him were moving too fast. He felt he had to respond to those criticisms. In that letter I was moved by King's vision:

"Moreover, I am cognizant of the interrelatedness of all communities and states. I cannot sit idly by in Atlanta and not be concerned about what happens in Birmingham. Injustice anywhere is a threat to justice everywhere. We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. Never again can we afford to live with the narrow, provincial "outside agitator" idea. Anyone who lives inside the United States can never be considered an outsider anywhere within its bounds."

We have been talking about sharing God's love in the world. That love binds us together and calls us to stand for justice and hope for all people. And where those things are absent we are all losers, we are all injured. Our speaker for the day Joe Ellwanger said, "The reason people cannot believe in the church today, is because they do not see the love of God lived out in acts of justice. Justice is not just an add-on to our mission, it is at the heart of our mission." I had thrust upon me once again, that the love of God always is about justice. The love of God is not only a heavenly spiritual reality, but an earthly reality that seeks new life and new possibility for all God's children. It is a love that risks, even risks being taken advantage of.

In the fall I led a discussion group of Martin Luther as a voice for justice. In my research, I was amazed to learn that Martin Luther was the one who developed the idea of our modern welfare system. He said that it was wrong for families, and especially children, to go hungry at night. And so he developed a system whereby everyone in the town of Wittenberg and the surrounding area were required to put

money into what he called The Wittenberg Common Chest. Anyone who was in need could come and seek relief. The funds provided for food and medicine for those in need, education for those who needed training, loans to people to get out from under high interest loans, dowries for poor women seeking to be married, and many other things. It was a communal relief for the poor of the community. When asked about the possible abuse Luther answered:

"He who has nothing to live on should be aided. If he deceives us, what then? He must be aided again."

Luther stood in the face of abuses of clergy and political power and risked all, not just to offer assistance, but so that the entire system could be changed. He was not perfect, sometimes his own prejudice and ignorance got in the way, but then there was confession, forgiveness and a call to take a stand once more.

I don't always know what it means to stand for justice, but I do know that the true love of Christ calls us to take a stand in our lives. To use our voice and our vote and our lives to work to build the beloved kingdom that Christ came to bring and people like Martin Luther and Martin Luther King talked so boldly about. Christian love must never remain inside the walls of the church, but must always be at work in the world around us. Let me close with a paraphrase of the closing words of King's letter:

"I hope this letter finds you strong in the faith... Let us all hope that the dark clouds of injustice will soon pass away and the deep fog of misunderstanding will be lifted from our fear drenched communities, and in some not too distant tomorrow the radiant stars of love and brother and sisterhood will shine over our nation and world with all their scintillating beauty."

BEING GREEN IN THE SNOW

A way to make winter a little greener is to avoid using toxic chemical de-icing salts and sand. Homeowners typically use salt and sand on icy sidewalks and roads to make them safer, but they aren't the best for the environment. Before choosing a chemical de-icer, consider its impact on plant life, concrete, vehicles and animals. And although sand isn't corrosive, it can clog storm drains and cause flooding in the spring. Even rock salt can cause environmental contamination and damage pavement.

There is no easy answer to the problems of ice and snow, but be aware that there are alternative approaches to dealing with this and seek out the one that does the least damage to the environment. We are the ones God has trusted to care for the earth. May we all do our best to be worthy of that trust.

"Keeping the Promise" Rotation will be starting February 12th

"Keeping the Promise" is a special rotation presented within Trinity's children's ministry every year. It is made up of five workshops especially designed to help each grade level develop a deeper understanding of one aspect of the promise their parents made for them at their baptisms. This rotation is designed directly from the baptismal vows:

*In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully **bring him/her to the services of God's house, and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments.** As he/she grows in years, you should place in his/her hands **the Holy Scriptures** and provide for his/her instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of their Baptism and in communion with the Church, he/she may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.*

For five weeks each 1st – 5th Grader will be exposed to five different presentations of the baptismal focus for their grade level:

- 1st Grade – The Lord's Prayer
- 2nd Grade – The Ten Commandments
- 3rd Grade – The Books of the Bible
- 4th Grade – The Apostle's Creed
- 5th Grade – The Worship Service and Communion

To be fully successful, this rotation will require that each child's loved ones discuss their topics and work with them to learn the material. This rotation will also include presentations and celebrations. **For the 5th Graders, "Keeping the Promise" includes the First Communion workshop on Friday and Saturday, February 10th and 11th, and their First Communion on March 5th at the 8:00am service.**

This rotation requires extra work on the part of the shepherds, rotation leaders and parents. But it is our attempt to faithfully "keep the promise" we all made to God and our children.

1st Communion Workshop Feb 10th & 11th, 2017



All 5th grade (or above) youth **AND** their parents are invited to come to a special workshop that will prepare them to receive their **First Communion this year at the 8:00am Worship Service on Sunday, March 5th.** (As part of their "Keeping the Promise Rotation" they will also be leading this worship service).

The workshop involves **two sessions** with a group meal following the Saturday morning session. This year's dates are **Friday, February 10th from 6:30pm to 8:30pm and Saturday, February 11th from 9:30pm to Noon.** **This workshop is for BOTH the youth AND their parent(s).** We realize that this is a significant block of time, but have found it to be a good time of spiritual growth and sharing for the youth, their parents and their whole families.

Parents, please take seriously how important your own faith journey is to the spiritual development of your children!

We will try to arrange additional childcare for younger siblings at the church if this would help you – PLEASE LET US KNOW ASAP!

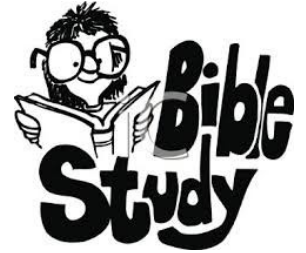
