About Our Weekend Worship This Lenten Season:

Faith tradition says that when the writers of scripture wrote down the words God inspired, they wrote merely chapter headings. It is left to each generation to fill in the chapter through their own experience and reflections on the text. Each word is pregnant with interpretations which are our responsibility to bring to Birth. This Lent we reflect on six symbols of Jesus' Passover meal. We thus help "birth" them in our own time and place. Giving birth to spiritual truth is not an intellectual act. It is an act of love and an act revealing the Love of God. Passover symbols are symbols for the faith journey - the hardship and freedom - of all God's people.

A festive candle is lit at the beginning of each weekend worship because the Passover table is always set in a most festive manner. The meal is celebrated with joy as well as drama. The candle is lit by the mother of the family. The words she speaks are part of a traditional blessing recited at the beginning of the Passover meal. A child then asks the opening question which parallels the youngest Jewish child's question at every Passover meal "Why is this night different from all other nights?"

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY/NUNSENSE/KARL'S PLACE

"Keeping the Promise" Rotation will be starting Feb. 11th

"Keeping the Promise" is a special rotation presented within Trinity's children's ministry every year. It is made up of five workshops especially designed to help each grade level develop a deeper understanding of one aspect of the promise their parents made for them at their baptisms. This rotation is designed directly from the baptismal vows:

In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring him/her to the services of God's house, and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As he/she grows in years, you should place in his/her hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for his/her instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of their Baptism and in communion with the Church, he/she may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.

For five weeks each 1st – 5th Grader will be exposed to five different presentations of the baptismal focus for their grade level:

1st Grade – The Lord's Prayer

2nd Grade – The Ten Commandments

3rd Grade – The Books of the Bible

4th Grade – The Apostle's Creed

5th Grade – The Worship Service and Communion

To be fully successful, this rotation will require that each child's loved ones discuss their topics and work with them to learn the material. This rotation will also include presentations and celebrations. For the 5th Graders, "Keeping the Promise" includes the First Communion workshop on Friday and Saturday, February 9th and 10th, and their First Communion on March 4th at the 8:00am service.

This rotation requires extra work on the part of the shepherds, rotation leaders and parents. But it is our attempt to faithfully "keep the promise" we all made to God and our children.


