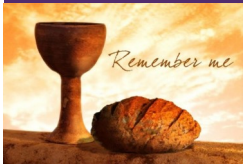

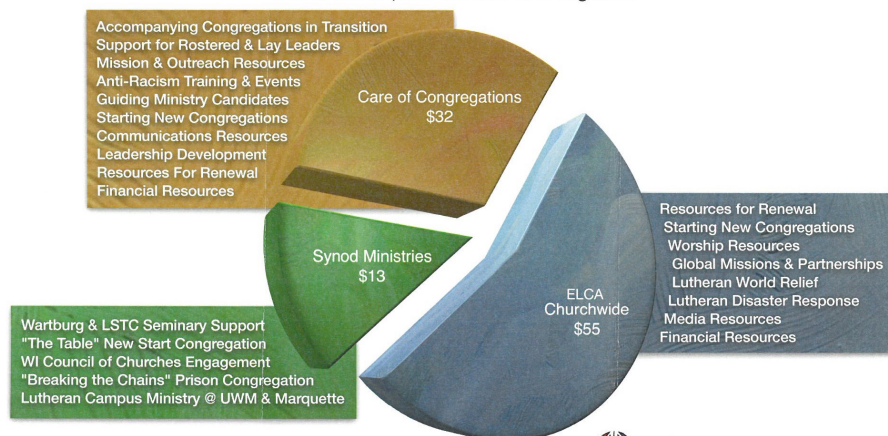
The workshop involved **two sessions** with a group meal following the Saturday morning session. Thank you to all who participated in this chance to grow together on our journey of faith.

LENTEN WORSHIP/YOUTH FUNDRAISERS



About Our Weekend Worship This Lenten Season:

Faith tradition says that when the writers of scripture wrote down the words God inspired, they wrote merely chapter headings. It is left to each generation to fill in the chapter through their own experience and reflections on the text. Each word is pregnant with interpretations which are our responsibility to bring to Birth. This Lent we reflect on six symbols of Jesus' Passover meal. We thus help "birth" them in our own time and place. Giving birth to spiritual truth is not an intellectual act. It is an act of love and an act revealing the Love of God. Passover symbols are symbols for the faith journey - the hardship and freedom - of all God's people.

A festive candle is lit at the beginning of each weekend worship because the Passover table is always set in a most festive manner. The meal is celebrated with joy as well as drama. The candle is lit by the mother of the family. The words she speaks are part of a traditional blessing recited at the beginning of the Passover meal. A child then asks the opening question which parallels the youngest Jewish child's question at every Passover meal "Why is this night different from all other nights?"

TRINITY MIDWEEK WORSHIP, THURSDAYS 6:30–7:00 PM, FROM NOW TO MARCH 22ND

This year we will bring back a midweek worship opportunity here at Trinity. We will be using a version of Prayer Around the Cross for these Lenten Worship Opportunities.

These 30-minute worship opportunities will take place in our darkened sanctuary, include scripture and poetry, simple sung chants and songs, the lighting of candles and opportunities for quiet reflection and healing actions. Prayer Around the Cross is a style of worship that borrows from the communities of Taize, France, Iona, Scotland, and Holden Village retreat center in Washington State. During this time, we gather around a large cross that is laid on the floor in the front of the worship space. At one point during the service, individuals are invited, if they wish, to come forward to light a candle as a sign of hope and place it around the cross.

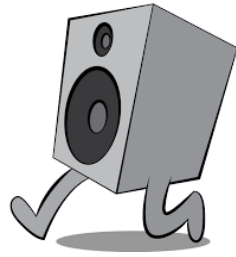

Sound System Update

The movement toward the upgrade of the sound system is underway. We had hoped to be all finished by Easter but it looks like it will be a few weeks beyond before things are complete. The equipment is being ordered for the upgrades. The specifics of the upgrade are being planned including some electrical re-working that will be necessary.



Because of some generous givers we have the beginning of the funds needed for the project, but we need all of you to get involved. A letter will be coming shortly if it has not already reached you asking you to offer gifts to the project. This is an important part of our life together. The sound system enhances our worship services, helps us send those services out to our shut-ins, make it possible to do events like the Cantata and the Harmene concert, is used in first communion and confirmation programs, and a host of other important ministries. All of us have benefited by its use. So in any way you can, please join in this important project.

A Greener Easter

Here are some ideas from "The Greener Ideal" staff for making Easter a little more eco friendly...

- ◆ Instead of buying a plastic basket at your local store, think of ways to improvise. If you want something green but fancy, there's a wide selection of wooden and wicker baskets you could find at your local florist or gift shop.

If you want to try and find something around your house as a substitute, think about using an old flower basket instead. After all, it's what's *in* the basket that your kids will be most impressed with.

- ◆ When it comes to lining your basket with something fun, don't bother picking up the bags of shredded plastic at your local store – instead, try running a few pieces of construction paper or fabric through a paper shredder.

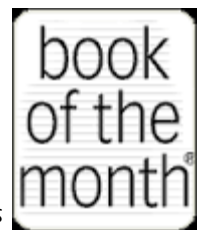
If you plan a week or two ahead, you can actually **use real grass** to fill your basket. Just line the basket with a layer of plastic, put a few inches of soil in, and sprinkle some wheatgrass seeds on top. Keep them moist, and when they start to sprout, put them in the sun. By Easter morning you should have a nice organic basket with fresh and real grass!

- ◆ Try buying organic or fair trade chocolate. Organic chocolate is made the same as most other chocolate except that the cocoa beans have not been sprayed with pesticides. Fair trade chocolate assures that the farmers who grew the cocoa and sugar are paid a fair price for their work and help build a better quality of life for these people.

After all the snow I hope for a green Easter. How about you?

The March book is the medieval mystery **The Name of the Rose** by Umberto Eco.



The Name of the Rose is the 1980 debut novel by Italian author Umberto Eco. It is a historical murder mystery set in an Italian monastery, in the year 1327, an intellectual mystery combining semiotics in fiction, biblical analysis, medieval studies and literary theory. It was translated into English by William Weaver in 1983.

Women of Trinity Bible Study

Calling all women interested in morning Bible study with Pastor Dave using the Gather Magazine. We will meet the **first Wednesday of each month at 10:00 am (Please note new time)**. Mark Allan Powell explores what Biblical stories mean to people around the world. Powell, a professor of New Testament at Trinity Lutheran Seminary in Columbus, Ohio, has taught at seminaries in Estonia, Russia and Tanzania. He edited the HarperCollins Bible Dictionary and has written more than 100 articles and 25 books on the Bible and religion.



Session three: The good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37)

In session three of this Bible study, we further explore the ways in which Bible stories come to mean different things to different people. Session three explores how two of the best known stories in the Bible (the parables of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son) have impacted culture, including cultures different from our own.



It won't be long before it's time to change the clocks again. Daylight saving time begins on **Sunday, March 11, 2018 at 2:00 am**. Here are some things about DST: The correct title is "daylight *saving* time," though it is commonly called daylight savings; DST is also referred to as "summer time," especially in the United Kingdom; It was first called "fast time" in the US when it was introduced in 1918; Germany was the first country to switch to DST in 1916, but the town of Thunder Bay in Ontario, Canada, was the first to implement it in 1908; Less than 40 percent of the world uses DST; In the US every state or territory has the right to bypass DST.
