Care of Creation

These words are from the ELCA social statement, **Caring for Creation: Vision, Hope, and Justice...**

Our church recognizes that as Children of God we are called in to a special relationship with God, each other and the creation. Decisions of how best to care for the earth are never easy. And yet as Christians we are called to take our responsibility with the earth, a trust from God, very seriously.

- Gun violence in the U.S. continues to be a major problem. The answers seem to elude us. Pray that God would help our leaders to look closely at the problem and guide them as they seek solutions.
- Natural disasters such as the volcano in Hawaii continue to present challenges and struggles. Pray for strength and comfort to those who have lost loved ones, their place to live, or in any way find themselves struggling to rebuild.
- Divisions of class, politics, race, and ideology continue to divide us as a nation and a world. Pray that God would grant us hearts to truly listen to each other, to honestly share in love, to have compassion for all people, and a passion for building a community in which all may find a place.
- Pray that each of us might hear the call of God to make a difference in the world through our prayers, through our words and through our actions.
- Pray each day for all those who you know are struggling with illness, grief, pain, or sin. Pray that God would touch them with healing and hope.
