

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

At our synod assembly this year we were encouraged to invite people who might have the gifts for ministry to consider becoming a pastor. Projections are that (at present) we will reach a point where we will only have 50% of the people needed to fill the pastoral needs of the church. Ouch. From Trinity, however, we have seen a number of people (including our son) hear and respond to the call to serve the Church. What's more, we have the potential within our congregation for many more. We encourage everyone to consider whether God is calling you to serve as a leader in the Church.

It also means that we all need to consider how God is calling us to serve and care in our lives. At this time in our church life, God may be reminding us of the importance of each person to spread the Good News in their lives by all they do.

Are there people around you right now who need the loving touch of one of God's people? Maybe they need a prayer right now and maybe you are the person to offer it.

Is there an older person right next door who could use a visit, or some help in their life. There was a call recently from a young adult who had come through Trinity's youth program who was looking for a way to help an aging neighbor. They were offering their care and concern, In doing that, they were answering God's call.

Are there activities or ways that God is calling you to to share God's love in your community or beyond? Maybe you are being called to be a big brother or sister. Maybe God is speaking to you about those who need a home and is calling you to Family Promise, or Habitat for Humanity, or maybe to be a foster parent.

Is God calling you to take on a social issue such as racism, poverty, violence, or some other aspect of our life together? Maybe God is calling you into the area of... politics (oh my), as a field where you can express God's love.

Maybe as we are struggling to fill Pastoral vacancies in the larger Church, it is time to remember the importance of each of us in the work of the kingdom. In the end the truth is that all of us are called. What is your call?

We may not all be pastors, but we are all ministers of the Lord.






Zachery Schicker -

A Report about our Experience at the 2018 Greater Milwaukee ELCA Synod Assembly

Hazel Griffin, Phil Pierce and myself (Sandy Poenitsch) were the three people who volunteered and were nominated to attend the 2018 Greater Milwaukee ELCA Synod Assembly held in Pewaukee, May 31-June 2 this year. Also attending were retired Pastor, Paul Bauman, Jerry Schmidt (MERU), Donna Hallada and our Pastors (on alternating days).

The assembly itself was a very good experience, grounded in faith, lead by a very passionate and personable Bishop (Paul Erickson) and filled with a number of different perspectives on racism, worship, outreach and ways we can connect with each other. The theme of the assembly was Trusting the Winds of the Spirit: Curiosity, Courage, Compassion. It began on Thursday evening with an eye-opening and inspiring message entitled, "How Did We Get Here?" delivered through Reggie Jackson, a native of Milwaukee and the Head Griot (docent) of America's Black Holocaust Museum in Milwaukee. Reggie asked us to take the Harvard Implicit Bias Test and suggested these steps in breaking down barriers:

Steps to Take (The Easy Stuff) 1. Get out of your bubble; 2. Pay attention to your habits; 3. Become aware of biased behavior; 4. Replace your automatic judgments of others; 5. Develop a strong desire and motivation to seek change; 6. Create a strategy to build your own personal understanding of others; 7. Study alternative sources written by people from other groups that you are not familiar with

Steps to Take (The Hard Stuff) 1. Make a concerted effort to build real, genuine friendships with people from other groups; **2.** See for yourself, listen for yourself, and think for yourself; **3.** Call out your friends, family members, co-workers, etc., for prejudices and discriminatory behaviors; **4.** Stop trying to prove that you're colorblind; **5.** Recognize that our personal biases come from our life experiences; **6.** Turn off the TV and talk radio and pick up a book about American history

Another very enthusiastic young speaker (proud to be in the 35 and under group!) that had an impact on us was Xavier Thomas from All People's Church in Milwaukee. Xavier had us smiling and sitting up straight as he shared a spirit-filled personal testimony about his love for God, the church that found him and for the grace he found there. He shared that he is planning to go to school and enter the ministry and anticipated about what worship might look like when that happens. Additionally, a short video of Joe Davis reciting a poem entitled "Show UP" had a strong message and impact.

Three breakout sessions: Curiosity, Courage and Compassion took place on Friday afternoon. Reggie Jackson's talk overlapped with the session Hazel, Phil, Donna and I attended on Curiosity in that he promoted making a sincere effort to get out of our bubbles and make connections with people that are different from ourselves. Paul Bauman, who attended Courage, said the most significant discussion, for him, occurred in the small groups, and were focused on racial justice.

We learned a lot about our Synod during the assembly. The synod is involved in a great deal of outreach both locally and through partnerships with Tanzania. Outreach for Hope was highlighted as a very effective mission in the greater Milwaukee area. One of their main fundraisers this fall is a Bike Ride for Hope. The synod also has resources to help congregations answer the questions we might have around; "what are our gifts?", and "where are we called to serve?". We don't have to reinvent the wheel - we are invited to take advantage of available resources. Also, though they are not run specifically by our synod, there are a number of financial instruments connected to the ELCA: the Mission Investment Fund and the new ELCA Credit Union.

The Bishop also shared a need from our Synod for more clergy and asked us all to recruit people with gifts toward the ministry. The number of people coming out of seminary right now only meet about 50% of the demand for pastors. Paul Bauman would also like for us (Trinity) to consider, if possible, helping support those from our congregation who are on that path (financially).

Some of the mechanics of the Assembly was passing the Synod budget and these resolutions:

Resolution 1 (passed) - 2018 Greater Milwaukee Synod Assembly Resolution in Commitment to more fully embracing the Reconciling in Christ identity on the Greater Milwaukee Synod.

Resolution 2 (passed) - 2018 Greater Milwaukee Synod Assembly Resolution in support of expanding support of Prison Congregation, Prison/Jail re-entry ministry and Prison reform Advocacy

There are a couple things I happened to write down while at the assembly that stood out.

1. The Gift of God comes wrapped in "people"; **2.** When we are not curious, we assume we already KNOW everything we need to know.


