More Outreach & Trinity Activities



This is the 19th anniversary of the **Gingerbread House Gift Giving Program.**

The program is run completely by volunteers with the help of donations from “sponsors” in the community. By mid-November the “giving tree” will appear in the Heritage Room loaded with wishes from local families.

Again this year the program is pleased to accept donations of gently used household items for the “General Store.” Items collected help fill daily basic needs and are available at no charge. ADULT FORUM

At the beginning of fall our worship focus was on creation and our place in it. That emphasis will be continued in the October and November adult forums. We will use a six session series called Earthbound which focuses on the Bibles’ call to care for creation, and the ways that we can answer that call. BIBLE STUDY

In October we will continue the study of the prophets by looking at the book of Hosea.



What if God asked you to marry a promiscuous partner? Then when they were unfaithful to go and reconcile with them and bring them home again? All this as an example of God’s action toward us unfaithful people. And what about the children?

This is the lot of the prophet Hosea. To me it seems he was called to one of the most painful and difficult prophetic experiences in scripture and yet this becomes a powerful example of God’s grace in the world. We’re kicking off the holiday giving season by collecting food items for Thanksgiving baskets. Here is a list of items that are needed to fill a basket:

I Never Thought Halloween Could be Green

I was surprised when I read some ideas for making your Halloween giving more eco-friendly. The ideas may not be for everyone but here are some thoughts from wilderness.org.

Choose green Halloween treats with less packaging: Decrease candy packaging waste by buying in bulk and selecting Halloween candy that uses the least packaging. Candies that come in individual boxes have a chance at getting recycled, whereas those that come in plastic don't. Other waste-less ideas include pencils made from recycled money, small coins or recyclable items that will find a useful place in a kid's life—as opposed to a home at the bottom of the garbage bin. One of our staff members reports of a neighbor who hands out books every year. Not a bad idea if you live in a neighborhood with light Halloween traffic.

Give organic Halloween candy: Yes, it's a bit pricier but certainly less scarier for the environment. Organic means less environmental damage during production and transportation, as well as healthier ingredients: [Endangered species chocolate](#) gives ten percent of net profits to fund endangered species and conservation products. [Yummy Earth](#) certified organic sells individually wrapped lollipops that can be purchased at Wholefoods, Vitamin Cottage, Sprouts and others.

YOUTH NEWS UPDATE

FISH—DID YOU KNOW???

4th - 6th Graders are considered the most "at risk" age group nationwide?

- ◇ If a young person doesn't make a central place for their faith at this age, it will become less likely to ever happen.
- ◇ If a youth identifies church with friendships and a feeling of belonging, they will WANT to be involved.

This ministry **CANNOT** happen without the support of BOTH youth and parents! We consider Trinity's ministry to this age group to be extremely important!!

FISH VISION

In grades 4 – 6 children's friendships become more and more vital to their opinions, behavior, and self-image. 4th – 6th Grade Youth Ministry provides a vehicle for deepening and expanding the connections between children made on Sunday mornings. In this way, we seek to help our younger youth develop friendships with those who will be their fellow travelers in the faith through their confirmation, Senior High, and adult years.

GOALS

- ◇ Bring 4th – 6th Grade youth together on a regular – once a month - basis for fun and group building experiences designed to encourage friendships.
- ◇ Provide opportunities **beyond Sunday morning activities** to deepen and enrich their faith.
- ◇ Give our younger youth a sense of **valuing each other for who they are to God.**

F.I.S.H. (*F*ollowing *I*mmanuel, *S*erving *H*appily)

Trinity's 4th - 6th Grade youth ministry is called – F.I.S.H. The monthly F.I.S.H. events are designed to grow both faith and friendships among Trinity's 4th-6th graders, many of whom attend different schools. Usually our events are "in house" in an effort to keep the "per family" cost down and to be sure that no one is prevented from participating because of cost. **This year FISH will usually meet one Sunday a month. Please pay careful attention to the dates below. Generally, each monthly event will take place in Fellowship Hall after Children's Ministry.** FISH "in-house" gatherings involve a meal, games, prizes and a craft. Each event has a theme based on the church year or a faith concept.
