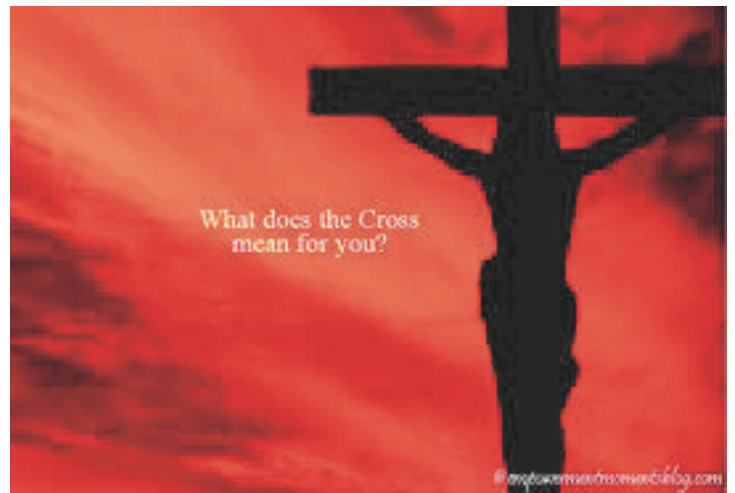

HERE WE ARE. IT'S LENT AGAIN!

For the two of us, Lent is a time to take stock of ourselves in a very special way. We ask two important questions in the midst of this season.

1) What does the cross of Christ mean to us and how does it change our lives?

There have been many times when this incredible expression of God's love has called us to new and sometimes challenging changes in our lives. At various times in our lives it has called us to renew our deep and loving commitment to each other in times of struggle, there have been times when the cross of Christ has called us to make sacrifices for our children, our congregation, and the world. There have been times when remembering the cross of Christ has upheld us by reminding us of the extent of God's love. These have been deeply personal and powerful revelations. To see the world through the cross changes everything. We will be focusing on this in worship as we look at the theme of *Cross Purposes*.



2) We take time to ask ourselves, "What is getting in the way of my relationship with our God who we meet in the cross of Christ?"

What are the things that we need to alter to deepen and renew our relationship to our Lord? Sometimes it means giving something up- TV time, some of the money we spend on self, old ways of approaching life. But often it means taking things on - more time in prayer and study, more time with people at risk in the community, more time with people we love. Most of the time it is some combination of the two. One year we kept a little box and the money we might have spent on going out to eat we put in the box for world hunger. In doing this we were reminded of the abundance God gives us and how sharing draws us closer to God and the world.

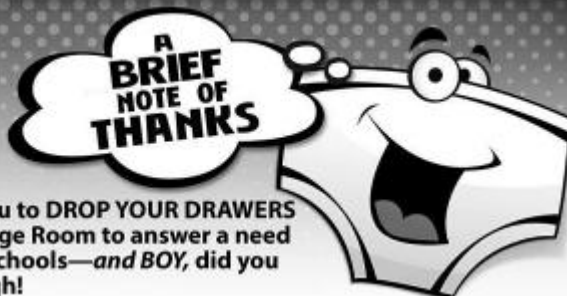
Seeking Donations and Firing Up Bidders

PRAYER CONCERNS



There is so much that is going on in the world these days, so you are invited to pray for the world and all its needs. Here are suggestions, but in your own way keep the world in your prayers.

- ◆ World hunger is a continuing problem. Around the world, more than enough food is produced to feed the global population—but 815 million people go hungry each year. (Sustainable Development Report).
- ◆ Refugees. There are 40 million people displaced in their own countries, almost 25 and half million people displaced from their country and 3.1 million asylum seekers. About 44,000 people a day are forced to leave their homes due to persecution or conflict.
- ◆ Divisions among people. These divisions take many forms- war, economic stratification, racism, inability of people to work across political and national lines.
- ◆ The earth. Whether you believe in global warming or not, our planet is facing not only changes in climate, but a host of other issues. The earth is harmed by deforestation, species reduction, loss of valuable wet lands and other types of important topography and the list goes on. Among the most noticeable problems in our cities is pollution of air and water.
- ◆ Genocide. Whole groups of people are targeted for extinction because of historical differences and hatred.
- ◆ Concerns around diseases such as HIV/AIDS and Malaria.
- ◆ Those who work for justice and a new day in the world such as the Red Cross, various divisions of the UN, Doctors Without Borders, Lutheran World Relief, CROP, Compassion International, FEMA, just to name a few.
- ◆ Peace. The world is in desperate need of peace for all people.
- ◆ Justice. So many people struggle under unjust systems in the world. The poor have little access to advocates and fair treatment under the law.
- ◆ Children. According to the world health organization: 1 in 4 adults were physically abused as children, 12% of children were sexually abused in past year, 37% of the World Health Organization reports implementing child sexual abuse prevention interventions on a larger scale.
- ◆ The aging. The aging face financial and medical problems, and often are quietly suffering rather than seeking the help they need.

GREENESS OF SPRING

Spring is a time when we look for the snow to melt and the green plants and flowers to arise. Spring is a symbol of new life. As we approach spring we have the opportunity to promote and preserve life in the way we act. Here are some ideas from Earth 911:

1. Declutter your life especially by donating things you don't need to people who do need it.
2. Spring clean the natural way using environmentally friendly cleaning solutions. (Many recipes can be found on line.)
3. Go for an energy upgrade. Change thermostats, install energy efficient appliances, move toward new and cleaner methods of energy and energy use. Install shades and weatherize your home.
4. Wash your car at a car wash?

While you may think you're doing your car (and your wallet) a favor by hand-washing it at home, it's actually the opposite.

According to the International Car Wash Association, automatic car washes use less than half the water used when washing your car at home. The average home wash uses 80-140 gallons of water while the commercial average is 45 gallons.

Commercial car washes often reuse water and send the runoff to treatment centers instead of nearby lakes and streams. They also use high-pressure nozzles that require less water usage.

5. Compost
6. Plant a garden
7. Use a gas grill rather than charcoal



According to a recent study by Environment Impact Assessment Review, "The overwhelming factors are that as a fuel, LPG (liquefied petroleum gas) is

dramatically more efficient than charcoal in its production and considerably more efficient in cooking." The two grilling methods were defined by their overall footprint, with charcoal using 998 kg of CO₂, almost three times more than propane, which weighed in at 349 kg. So enjoy the green of nature and maybe give her a hand.
