Congregational Finances

As of March 18th there is minus \$988 in available cash. We are continuing to function because of two members who have paid the offering for the whole year. But pro-rating that over 12 months brings us to that minus \$988. Offerings are \$10,000 behind where we were last year. We encourage everyone to keep current on their financial commitments and remember the three challenges our council president set for us at the Annual Meeting:

- 3. Increase your weekly giving by \$1**

- ♥ Fleece Blanket Tying. Sit and socialize while helping us get a jump on a stock of blankets to share with Holiday Hope next winter!
- ♥ Habitat for Humanity. If Habitat for Humanity is where your service heart is, please sign up to indicate your interest! Habitat requires a minimum number of participants in order to staff a build site with their own personnel. This opportunity can only be offered if enough people sign up for it!
- ♥ Fiesta Latina is a daylong festival of food, music, culture, and fun held at Regner Park, and it is Casa Guadalupe's biggest fundraiser for the year. Their primary means of volunteer signup is through SignUp Genius – if you would like assistance in signing up, see Hazel Griffin. There are shifts of 2-4 hours available throughout the day (8 a.m.-9 p.m.) for everything from greeting, ticket sales, supervising games, food and beverage sales and much more! Youth ages 13 and older are invited to assist with kids games, bounce house supervision, greeting people at entrances/exits and cleanup during the event. We feel that is vital that everyone know that **THE CHURCH BUDGET DOES NOT PAY ANYTHING TOWARDS THE SENIOR HIGH SUMMER TRIP!!**

All the money for the trips comes from the following sources:

- 1) Money paid toward the trip by the families of the travelers.
- 2) Money from fund raising
- 3) Generous donations made to subsidize and offer financial aid **specifically to be sure this ministry continues.**

No money for the summer trip uses church funds available for anything else!!

The Earth is Bringing Forth New Life, and We Should Give New Life to the Earth

The Los Angeles Regional Agency has the following suggestions for that pesky Spring Cleaning:

1. **Less Stuff = Less Cleaning** You've already committed to tackling that huge mess in your garage, attic, basement or yard, but you're feeling overwhelmed. The best thing to do is: reduce! Logic says if you have less stuff, you have less stuff to clean. So, start with separating the things you *actually* use from the things that you'd like to use (but never have.) Put them in a pile—we'll get back to those things later. Now breathe, you just got through step one. Whew!
2. **Out with the Old—Time to Renew** Time to get back to that "reduce" pile from step one. Take a little look-see to find out if you can reuse any of those items. Can that old dresser become a cute **minibar**? Or could that **bike wheel** become a cool outdoor spring decoration? Now, don't just keep it because you think you might someday reuse it for that cool upcycle project. That's how we got into this mess in the first place. But, if you truly know that you will give it a new life, do it! Otherwise, it stays in the pile.
3. **It's Better to Give Than Receive** We've all heard that message since we were kids. So evaluate which items you don't need or aren't going to use, and decide if they'll be better off with someone else. Do you know someone that needs your extra coffee maker or that exercise machine you use as a clothes hanger? If you have the patience to sell your "get rid of" pile, try Craigslist, Wallapop, Offerup, Ebay, or any other selling app. If you just can't stand that sight of it, donate it to Goodwill, post it on Freecycle, or give it to a friend.
4. **Rejuvenate, Refresh, Recycle** Now that you've sorted, reduced, reused, donated, and sold your items, it's time to find out what can be recycled. There are some obvious things that have been hanging around your home like papers, plastics and metals. But, don't forget that old TV, VCR, computers, cell phones, batteries and paint. Find out where you can **recycle those outdated gadgets**. Not only is it illegal to throw them in the garbage, it's very uncool.
5. **Squeaky-Clean Spring** Your home is now clutter-free! But, there's still a filmy layer of summer, fall, and winter covering your home, and since you made a vow to live a more sustainable lifestyle, you want to make sure you're using more natural cleaning products. There are many sources of information for environmentally friendly cleaning products. Enjoy the green of the world around you and help preserve it. Happy Easter.
