As our kids grew up and moved out, here was something deeply lost. Our time together would become so much more limited. Yet we developed new and deeper relationships and the time we have is just as precious.

When my mom died, I realized that things would never be the same. Over time though, I realized that what she had helped me become continued on in how I faced the world.

There is much in the world to pray about. Here are some suggestions, but please pray as your heart calls you:


- There has been much recent violence against place of worship. Pray for comfort for those who have been victims and for power to rebuild and renew their faith.


Signup Genius Invitations

Signup genius e-mail invitations go out at least once a month.





On June 8-9, we will celebrate Pentecost and receive new members. Pentecost has been called the birthday of the Church, but it is so much more. It is not just the celebration of the Holy Spirit's creation of the Church, but the power of the Holy Spirit at work in the Church today within each of us and among and through us.

As part of our celebration, together we will invite the Holy Spirit into our midst to move in new and exciting ways. - 4. How can I affirm others in their life in the community? We all need encouragement as we live the life of the Spirit together.
- 5. At Pentecost we will once more consider what it means to be a member of the Church. We are not just attendees or consumers, but disciples called into life together as the body of Christ. The Spirit did not just move thousands of years ago the Spirit is alive among us today, calling forth a living breathing Church of many members.

WE ARE THE BODY OF CHRIST and individually members of it. This Pentecost and throughout the coming year may this and all parts of the body of Christ find new life as we live together in the promise of a God that turns dead ends into new beginnings.
