But the essence of life is growth, is change, is movement into a new day. That is symbolized in the new commitments our confirmands will make on October 13<sup>th</sup>. You are invited to come and renew your commitment to growth with them. One of the most powerful images in the book of Acts is at the very beginning of the book. Jesus has ascended into heaven. For the disciples, everything has changed. What are they to do now? They stand looking up to where Jesus has gone, and some angels appear and speak these words:

#### **HAPPY RALLY DAY 2019!**





Continuing the theme of books that call us to grow as God's people, for this month we will be reading <u>Dear Church</u> by Lenny Duncan. Here is a description of the book from Amazon:

Lenny Duncan is the unlikeliest of pastors. Formerly incarcerated, he is now a black preacher in the

whitest denomination in the United States: The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). Shifting demographics and shrinking congregations make all the headlines, but Duncan sees something else at work--drawing a direct line between the church's lack of diversity and the church's lack of vitality. The problems the ELCA faces are theological, not sociological. But so are the answers. Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter. Dear Church offers a bold new vision for the future of Duncan's denomination and the broader mainline Christian community of faith. Dear Church, rejects the narrative of church decline and calls everyone--leaders and laity alike--to the front lines of the church as renewal through racial equality and justice. It is time for the church to rise up, dust itself off, and take on forces of this world that act against God: whiteness, misogyny, nationalism, homophobia, and economic injustice. Duncan gives a blueprint for the way forward and urges us to follow in the revolutionary path of Jesus.

This book truly is a love letter encouraging Lenny's church, our church, to become what it can be. There will be two opportunities to discuss the book. The first will be at 8:30 AM Thursday October 17<sup>th</sup>. The second will be on Thursday October 24<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 PM. Whether you can join us for discussion or not, please take time to read this powerful book and think about where it is calling us to travel.

#### Why should I give money to Trinity??

It is time to consider our financial commitment to the work of Trinity Lutheran Church. Without the commitment of every member we cannot continue to do the vibrant ministry that we carry out in our community. As many of you know, last year we had to cut salaries on staff that keep our variety of ministries running in order to meet the budget. This limited Trinity's ability to reach out to share the love and promise of God both with church members and within our community and world.

We realize that here are many worthy causes asking for your support. But please consider that Trinity is called to a role that no other single charity can fulfill. Our purpose is:

To communicate and pass on the faith - an understanding of ourselves and the world rooted in the love, grace and forgiveness of a God who is still at work within all God's creation to bring new life, growth. wholeness, connectedness and hope.

To encourage, illuminate, inspire and support people so they are better able to notice and care about the needs and issues that are happening beyond their own present personal experience.

To bring together people from various backgrounds, experiences, and generations to form a community of respect, support and encouragement that allows people to recognize and use their gifts to touch a divisive, isolated, selfabsorbed and despairing culture with God's love.

To provide each generation with the roots of love, strength, hope, purpose that will help them stand, grow and shine amidst the pain, hopeless and darkness of the world they face.

To illustrate God's work of compassion, renewal, growth and life going on all around us. If each member of this congregation could give \$5.00 more a week (the cost of a trip to Starbucks or a Cheeseburger meal at McDonalds) we could reinstate and even expand our ability to live out our role as carriers of love, grace, life and hope.

Throughout October, stewardship materials for the 2020 will be made available that outline the way our financial resources are used to carry on the ministry of Christ. You will see that we do not use our funds extravagantly, but faithfully use each cent to do our work.
