
Dear Trinity Family,

A short time ago we sent a letter explaining the intention of Trinity's leadership to move somewhat slowly in coming back together. We have received some comments urging us to consider coming back together as soon as possible.

To assure you that that is definitely the intention of all involved, we want you to know that we are putting together a team to consider the best way to move back toward in person gatherings. The team will be considering some outdoor worship opportunities, some small in person prayer services, some safe social gatherings and other possibilities. We hope to have some of these things in place by late June or early July. I know for many this will still not be fast enough. It is important, however that we take seriously the ever growing body of information about this disease and disease spread in general and the urgings of the larger church.

As part of helping everyone be aware of the information we are using to evaluate the in person worship options we are encouraging everyone to go to the https://milwaukeesynod.org click on the tab marked covid-19 and read Bishop Paul Erickson's letter of May 12th. In his letter he includes helpful links for evaluating the present information we have on covid-19. We know this is a lot to absorb, but hopefully this will assure you that we are not moving any more slowly then we think is prudent and healthy both for the individuals we serve and the life of the congregation. Please take time to examine this material and let us know if there are any questions.

As pastors we are usually reluctant to share the struggles of this office, but a friend of ours posted on their Facebook the perfect image of how many pastors are feeling right about now:



We are doing our very best to balance the concerns of those who are at risk, those with deep concerns about the future of the church, those who have been devastated by this disease, those comfortable with the new way of doing things, those who are hurting under the isolation, and everyone who longs for inperson worship.

But please know the life of the church is never defined by our gathering in the building. We are the church wherever we are, and in all the circumstances of life. We are bound by the Spirit of God which has no walls. We are one in love for one another.

Please keep us and each other in prayer.



- 2) A Bible study on 1st John on Tuesday evenings at 7:00 also using ZOOM at https://us02web.zoom.us/i/83634007073.



Prayer Concerns


