We can each use our power to vote for those people and policies we believe will help share the love of God in our life together. If we cannot vote in person we can vote by mail. We can also help our community by filling out our census forms so that helpful or necessary resources might come into our community. We can rally around the work of justice and equity.

And we can rally around our children. We can continue to share the story of the love of God with



WHAT TO EXPECT DURING A "PRAYER AROUND THE CROSS" WORSHIP:

You will <u>enter to a darkened church</u>, find a seat and silently prepare for worship. <u>There are no bulletins</u>. Any worship instructions will be given verbally during the worship time. <u>There are no song sheets or books</u>. The music is simple sung prayer. It consists of repeated phrases, tunes and refrains that can be easily picked up by the worshipers. Worshipers are encouraged to join in when they feel comfortable to help establish a prayerful setting and mind set. The musician(s) will teach any music that cannot easily be learned during the liturgy **at the beginning of worship.**

Recycling isn't just for the environment anymore. It's becoming an economic imperative and you could even consider it your patriotic duty. So says the top environmental officer of the U.S. who urged Americans to help fight a worldwide pandemic by recycling the packing materials from their delivery orders. With so many people creating waste at home, recycling is "more essential than ever right now" so said the EPA Administrator Andrew Wheeler. "Right now there is a critical need for all raw materials in the manufacturing supply chain, especially paper and cardboard."

Groups in the UK and Europe have also warned of possible shortages of cardboard as a result of increased home deliveries. With many businesses

shuttered and unable to recycle that means it's more important that households do their part. Americans recycled 66% of the paper they used in 2017, but only 8.4% of plastics were recycled that year. Here are 5 ways to be nice to the planet, reduce waste and support efforts to ship you all the things you need (and want!).

- 1. Recycle paper and cardboard
- 2. Reuse disposable bags
- 3. Reduce takeout waste
- 4. Fewer canned drinks
- 5. Stop with the PPE We are using a lot of personal protective equipment (PPE) to stay safe. Just don't throw your masks, gloves, and wipes into the recycling during the pandemic-or anytime. PPE is not recyclable and it's not safe for sanitation workers to touch it once it's been used. "These items should NEVER go into the recycling bin," Wheeler said.
