Dear Trinity Family,

As of the writing of this letter the infection rate of Covid-19 continues to climb and hospitals in many places are overloaded. Though the election seems to be a little more certain, cries of unfair continue to ring in the air. And we are presented for the first time in our 36 years of ministry with the real likelihood that we will not be able to gather together for Christmas worship and celebration.

That, however, does not stop Christmas in the least. The first Christmas occurred during a census commanded by Caesar that disrupted the lives of most people. In the city of Bethlehem the inn was overflowing and there was no room for a young couple expecting a baby except in a cave used to house the animals. Shepherds were looked down on as disreputable and unaccepted. Kings plotted murder on a grand scale. Yet, Christ came anyway. Christ came among us even in those circumstances and with him came the promise of light and life and new beginnings.

And, Christ still comes today. We will still sing the praises of God, because God was, is and always will be with us. Opportunities for bringing our hearts together still exsist. There will be a virtual advent cantata for all of us to share—*wherever we are.* We are offering advent activities to our families and online Daily Devotions for all of us to visit each day as we prepare our hearts for Jesus' coming. We will continue to worship together online and, on Christmas Eve, we will invite you to have candles ready to light *wherever you happen to be* We will also offer another drive-thru opportunity to share prayer and receive holy communion on Christmas Eve.

Christmas is different this year and yet Christmas still comes—wherever we are. A letter about Christmas written by Dietrich Bonhoeffer from a Nazi prison camp is a reminder to us that **there is nothing that can stop the power of God's love.** (SEE LETTER ON PAGE 3).

Nothing stops Christmas. Christ comes to us and for us-wherever we are.

Wherever you may be this Christmas and whatever we face as individuals, as families, and as a world, remember what the angels proclaim: "Do not be afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will be for all the people; for today in the city of David there has been born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there appeared with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased."

Wherever you are—peace.



Dear Parents.

Above all, you must not think that I will let myself sink into depression during this lonely Christmas. It will take it's own special place in a series of very different Christmases that I have celebrated in Spain, in America, in England, and I want in later years to be able to think back on these days not with shame but with a special pride. That is the only thing that no one can take from me.

I don't need to tell you how great my longing for freedom and for all of you is. But you have for so many decades provided us with Christmases so incomparably beautiful, that the grateful memories of them are strong enough to outshine even a dark Christmas.

From a Christian point of view, a Christmas in a prison cell is no special problem. It will probably be celebrated here in this house more sincerely and with more meaning than outside where the holiday is observed in name only. Misery, poverty, loneliness, helplessness, and guilt mean something entirely different in the eyes of God than in the judgment of men.

That God turns directly toward the place where men are careful to turn away; that Christ was born in a stable because he found no room in the Inn-a prisoner grasps that better than someone else. For him it really is a joyous message, and because he believes it, he knows that he has been placed in the Christian fellowship that breaks all the bounds of time and space; and the months in prison lose their importance.

On Holy Evening (Christmas Eve) I will be thinking of all of you very much, and I would very much like for you to believe that I will have a few beautiful hours and my troubles will certainly not overcome me.

If one thinks of the terrors that have recently come to so many people [with the heavy allied fire bombings] in Berlin, then one first becomes conscious of how much we still have for which to be thankful. Overall, it will surely be a very silent Christmas, and the children will still be thinking back on it for a long time to come. And maybe in this way it becomes clear to many what Christmas really is...

Dietrich Bonhoeffer was a German pastor and theologian known for his opposition to National Socialism. His ties to the July 20, 1944, conspiracy to overthrow the Nazi regime led to his execution in 1945. His theological writings are regarded as classics throughout the Christian world.

A LETTER FROM BISHOP ERICKSON

November 11, 2020 Friends in Christ,

On October 8, in response to Gov. Evers' executive order limiting the size of gatherings in Wisconsin, I released a message stating, "While religious organizations are legally exempt from this order, I am strongly urging all our congregations to refrain from gathering indoors for worship and other activities until mid-November at the earliest." Since then, we have seen a continued surge in the number of COVID-19 cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in every county of our synod and across the state.

Yesterday, Gov. Evers issued a new executive order, urging all Wisconsinites to stay home as much as possible and avoid gatherings with people not part of your immediate family and household. While this order is advisory and not mandatory, I believe it is prudent and wise for the congregations of our synod to follow it. I therefore am strongly urging all congregations of the Greater Milwaukee Synod to discontinue indoor gatherings for worship or other activities until at least January 2021.

I recognize that the vast majority of our congregations have been following this guidance, and I am grateful for your willingness to work together and participate in the efforts to slow the spread of this dangerous virus. I am also aware of several congregations that are continuing to gather for worship indoors. While these congregations may well be following guidelines regarding the wearing of masks, physical distancing, and other safety protocols, and while these congregations may not be aware of any COVID-related spread or outbreaks in their community, I believe the risks involved in gathering far outweigh the benefits. I urge you to reconsider the decision to gather indoors at least until the start of the new year.

When this pandemic began earlier this year, few among us could have known how long this would last and the kinds of decisions and sacrifices we would be asked to make. And now, as we prepare for a holiday season that will be unlike any we have experienced, I am well aware of the challenges and disappointments that continue to fill our lives. And yet, we are not without hope. There is promising news of an effective vaccine that may be widely available in the spring of 2021. As people of faith, we cling to the hope we have in the promises of Christ. This coming season of Advent can be a rich time of reflection and prayer, as we dwell in the silence and the longing of this season of waiting. Across our synod, congregations are experimenting with simple and creative ways to connect people to the promises of Advent and Christmas, even when we can't physically be together. In the words of one of my favorite Advent hymns, "Yet I believe beyond believing that life can spring from death, that growth can flower from our grieving, that we can catch our breath and turn transfixed by faith." (Each Winter As the Year Grows Older, ELW 252, verse 3).


