COUNCIL CORNER

2020—An Unusual Year for Trinity's Finances

When it was decided that Covid-19 would require us to avoid meeting together at Trinity in March, I was concerned about what that might do for our potential offering needs to meet our planned 2020 expenditures. However, my anxiety, and any of our Finance Committee and Congregation Council members, was replaced by joy and thanksgiving when month after month income was exceeding each month's lowered expenditures in 2020. This was not expected, and the monthly General Fund balances kept growing and growing to finally exceed \$60,000. We were all amazed at this financial support being provided in a pandemic year with worship services happening online and many other limited activities.

In the last month of 2020, December, the Council approved the Finance Committee's recommendation to create from this growing positive balance, a Contingency Fund of \$25,000 for future congregational potential needs, contribute \$5000 to the Leaders for Mission Fund of our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in the 50th Anniversary Year of Women's Ordination and also in thanksgiving for and in honor of both women pastors in Trinity's history, the Rev. Cristy Schoob and the Rev. Jennifer (Johnson) Arnold, plus to also give \$2000 to the Outreach for Hope Fund of our Greater Milwaukee Synod. The remaining money in our General Fund would be the balance to enter 2021. No one in our leadership group ever thought actions like this would have been possible in a pandemic year! Thank you to everyone whose generosity helped make this possible! It indeed made 2020 a most unusual and unexpected year with Trinity's finances! Thank you, thank you!

For your information, the Leaders for Mission Fund of our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America provides scholarships for seminary students, maybe a future pastor for Trinity, so that they can graduate without adding significant additional debt beyond what they may have accumulated through their college years. Outreach for Hope provides funds for Greater Milwaukee Synod congregations who are engaged in significant social ministry in their poverty stricken communities primarily in Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha. Both gifts provide ways we share the love and promise of God, our mission, with others. Again, thanks from a "relieved" Treasurer and leadership group, plus thanks to our Triune God whose Holy Spirit works among us to make us a generous people. *On to 2021 to see what the Spirit of God does in this year!*

NOTICE: ANNUAL MEETING POSTPONED

Due to the unprecedented circumstances the COVID-19 world pandemic has placed us in and our decision to maintain social distancing to protect all of us, including our most vulnerable, your Congregation Council took action during our December Meeting (via Zoom) to pass an emergency bylaw allowing us to postpone the Trinity Congregation Annual Meeting until such time that we can safely gather together in person. Council members whoes terms were ending in January of 2021 will continue to serve the congregation until that meeting can take place and new Council members can be elected. More details will be forthcoming in a letter to the congregation during the first weeks of the new year.

While we are not there yet, we are thankful for the vaccine, for this new year and the renewed HOPE that it brings. We look forward with joy and anticipation to the time we will be able to safely gather together as the Trinity family and worship inside our building once again.

But this month, I am excited to share an update that's a little closer to home! We have now been able to gather Compassion center status updates from each and every church partner!

We praise God for the work the staff have put into these updates and that we are able to offer you information about the center your child attends below!

Kaori's center in Peru is currently distance only! That means that staff and volunteers are not able to go to children's homes due to local restrictions and all communication is being done virtually.

I know it has been a long season of uncertainty — both for you and the child you sponsor. I hope knowing that each child is being cared for by staff and volunteers who know and love them brings you comfort in this season.

Thank you, again, for your continued support of Kaori. The stability your support offers means so much to her!

BREAKING THE CHAINS MINISTRY

Have you heard about the prison ministry organization called Breaking the Chains Church (BtCC)? The Greater Milwaukee Synod worked with Prison Congregations of America to develop a Lutheran congregation inside the Felmers Chaney Correctional Center (FCCC), a facility of the Wisconsin DOC in Milwaukee.

Reverend Mark Thompson and people from several congregations across the Milwaukee area work to cultivate relationships with Greater Milwaukee Synod churches, social agencies, and the incarcerated. The goal is to help give the men, all of whom have spent time in several facilities in the DOC system, an opportunity to enhance their spiritual foundation and to further prepare them for the very difficult challenge of reentry.

BtCC works to help provide spiritual support for those incarcerated at FCCC. During these Covid times a weekly worship that would normally happen inside the facility has been replaced with a weekly ZOOM worship service. And there are other activities going on such as members corresponding with the men. BtCC works to provide support to those just released from FCCC and their families to help them with the challenges of reentry.

BtCC is involved in advocacy activities, raising awareness of issues faced by the incarcerated on local, state, and national levels and works

for legal reform of laws dealing with the incarcerated.


