We are entering the season of Lent. According to one internet article:

Friends in Christ:

As we pass the one-year anniversary of the first case of COVID-19 in the United States, it's safe to say that most, if not all, of us are weary from the many changes and restrictions the pandemic has brought about. Our congregations, communities, and leaders have worked diligently and tirelessly to find new ways to worship, learn, connect, and serve. We have sought to stay true to our mission while following the guidance of our public health professionals. We have tried to find the right balance between the desire to gather with the need to do so safely. Through it all, we have been guided by our call to love our neighbor as ourselves. I am deeply grateful for all your efforts to continue faithful ministry in these unprecedented times.

You may recall that, on November 11, 2020, I encouraged the congregations of the Greater Milwaukee Synod to discontinue indoor gatherings for worship or other activities until at least January 2021. In recent weeks, we have seen the number of cases, hospitalizations, and deaths in Southeast Wisconsin plateau and decline a bit. We have also witnessed the release of two COVID-19 vaccines, which give us hope that the pandemic may someday come to an end.

In light of these developments, I know that many congregations are reviewing their plans for whether, when, and how to return to their buildings for worship and other activities. While I am also encouraged by recent trends and developments, I want to encourage congregations to continue refraining from holding in-person, indoor gatherings. I offer this recommendation based on the guidance provided by our partners in the Wisconsin Council of Churches. They have recently released an updated set of recommendations, *RETURNING TO CHURCH 2.0*. These recommendations are based on an extensive review of the scientific data and public health wisdom.

Here's a brief summary of their recommendations:

- Pay attention to these three indicators: vaccinations, new cases per 100,000 of population, and percentage of positive test results.
- There are three phases to consider: Unsafe to return, Safer, and Safest. Based on the most recent indicators, we are still in the "unsafe to return" phase in all counties of Wisconsin.
- When at least 50% of the population is vaccinated, new infections are less than 10 per 100,000 people, and the test positivity rate is less than 10%, we can begin to explore returning to in-person, indoor gatherings.
- Even though vaccine distribution is uneven across the state, encourage people to get vaccinated whenever it becomes available to them.
- The use of masks, distancing, hygiene and other safety protocols will need to continue for the foreseeable future.

The WCC documents include references to reliable sources of updated information that will allow you to track these numbers in your area. Based on current trends, it is likely that we are still several months away from being able to consider safely returning to indoor gatherings.


I recognize that the prospect of yet another Lent and Easter season without worshipping and gathering in person may be discouraging. I encourage congregations, leaders, and rostered ministers to consider the following:

- Regardless of what you decide, pay attention to how you decide. Work to create an
 environment in which people are able to speak, be heard, and understand which
 factors led to the decisions made.
- Recognize that this has been and will continue to be a stressful time for all of us, and
 the levels of weariness among your leaders is high. Be gentle with one another, and
 make sure that your pastors, deacons, and other staff have the support they need
 and that they are able to take time away. Consider allowing staff to roll over unused
 vacation time from last year to this year, or even granting additional vacation time
 this year.
- Trust that the Church is resilient, and God's Holy and life-giving Spirit has been with us every step of the way and will continue to guide, nourish, and embrace us whatever 2021 brings.

I continue to be grateful, proud, and hopeful for our congregations and our communities as we confront and respond to the many challenges of this pandemic. We're in this together, and I look forward to the time when we will be able to come together, in person, to discover what the next chapter of God's story will look like for us.

If anyone would be interested in discussion this book, please let Pastor Dave know and we will set up a time through Zoom.


THE SEASON OF LENT BEGINS

The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17th and continues through the celebration of Holy Week: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Morning on April 4th, 2021.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. Its official name is "Day of Ashes," so called because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the shape of a cross. Ashes are a public sign of our intent to die to our worldly desires and live in Christ. As our foreheads are marked with ashes, these words are said: "Remember, that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

You are invited to come into church on Ash Wednesday for the imposition of ashes (only). THIS IS NOT A WORSHIP SERVICE. Masks are required and social distancing will be practiced. SEE DETAILS ON THIS PAGE.

ASH WEDNESDAY | IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Wednesday | February 17 NOON - 1 PM and 6 PM - 7 PM

MASKS REQUIRED

You are invited to come into church to receive the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday, February 17th from NOON to 1 PM and 6 PM to 7 PM.

- Please ENTER through the west doors (off the alley) only.
- Masks are required and to maintain social distancing, we will have spaces taped off on the floor 6' apart (as we have become accustomed to seeing in grocery stores, etc.). Distanced line spacing will start in the Heritage room and continue all the way into the Sanctuary. Please follow these best practices to ensure each other's safety while waiting for your time of receiving ashes.
- To further keep each other safe, the Pastors will use long-handled Q-tips (one per person that will be discarded after use) to apply the ashes to our foreheads.
- After receiving the ashes, please EXIT the church through the door in the Sanctuary on the left side of the pulpet that leads directly to the west parking lot.

NOTE: Pre-packaged Communion cups will be available to pick up and take home on Ash Wednesday. There will be a time of Holy Communion lifted up as part of the Ash Wednesday virtual worship service that will be posted online—please use the pre-packaged Communion cups when you experience that worship service in your home.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Paper plate, Scissors cut out center and form a ring
- · Red and pink construction paper
- · Craft glue, glue stick or double-stick tape
- · Ribbon or string for hanging

DIRECTIONS:

- · Cut out heart shapes in varying sizes.
- Write a message that you want to share with your child on each heart, such as: You are just right, just the way you are! You are smart! You are special! You are funny! You are capable and strong! You are beautiful inside and out! You are kind! You are loved! I love your smile! You are hard working! You rock at reading/sports/drawing ... etc.
- Glue or tape hearts on the paper plate ring to create a heart wreath. Attach ribbon or string to the back in a loop for hanging.

COVID-19: Vaccine Phases and Eligibility | When can I get the COVID-19 vaccine?

COVID-19 vaccine is being distributed to Wisconsin residents in a phased approach. It is important to remember that vaccine supply is limited and vaccinations are targeted to specific groups of people with a higher risk for COVID-19 infection. It will take time to reach all people within each priority population and phase. There is not a hard start or stop for each phase. As vaccine supply and the number of vaccinators increase, phases for distribution may overlap.

The State of Wisconsin is committed to the equitable and fair distribution of the vaccine, and is following prioritization guidelines from the federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP)(link is external) and the State Disaster Medical Advisory Committee (SDMAC). Many of the priority populations included in each phase are still pending ACIP and SDMAC recommendations.

Who is eligible for the COVID-19 vaccine and where do people get vaccinated?

Wisconsin has over 1,200 COVID-19 eligible vaccinators across the state. Much like your flu vaccine, there will be options for where you get your COVID-19 vaccine. People will be vaccinated at many places including: health care providers, pharmacies, local health departments, places of employment, and mass vaccination clinics. Local health departments are coordinating many of the local options. Remember, Wisconsin does not have enough COVID-19 vaccine to vaccinate all eligible populations at this time.
