This is the nature of Easter life. It is both new and old. Jesus pointed to this reality when he said, 'Therefore every scribe who has been trained for the kingdom of heaven is like the master of a household who brings out of his treasure what is new and what is old.' Matthew 13:52

As we begin to return to worship together I have heard some people say, "it is time for us to do all kinds of new things," the old was disrupted by the pandemic. I have heard other say, "why can't we just go back to the old way we used to do things". The risen Lord reminded his disciples of all he had taught and then he sent them out to new places. The church developed new ways of thinking seeing, hearing, and sharing the Gospel. We are an Easter Church it is that simple. We are constantly being made NEW, while never forgetting from where we came.

At Pentecost we will once more consider what it means to be a member of the Church. We are not just attendees or consumers- but disciples called into life together as the body of Christ. The same Spirit that moved thousands of years ago is alive among us today, calling forth a living breathing Church of many members.


Please Continue Masking!




While we are learning and serving, we'll also leave plenty of time to take in all that the camp has to offer and have lots of fun!!
















In May we will study passages that celebrate the beauty and woholer of creation.
