

A new day. A new policy.

In keeping with the CDC COVID-19 guidelines, effective MAY 19, 2021 the policy of Trinity Lutheran Church is that:





- Those who are **NOT VACCINATED should continue to wear a mask for all activities inside Trinity**—especially and always while singing in worship. The exception will be those who cannot mask for medical reasons.
- We will continue to maintain social distanced seating inside the sanctuary and in all activities until numbers reach a point where that is no longer possible.

HERE IS THE RATIONALE. Almost all medical authorities are in agreement that those who are fully vaccinated do not significantly risk spreading the disease to anyone else. Those who are not vaccinated still have a moderate risk of contracting the disease and possibly spreading it to other non-vaccinated persons. Further, there are members of our congregational community who cannot be vaccinated. Thus we ask all non-vaccinated people to continue masking at all times - especially during singing because that is when particulates are spread farther. These measures can be revisited and dropped when our community reaches a higher level of community (herd) immunity.

These policies arise out of love and care for one another. Paul writes in Galatians 5: For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.'

In the end we cannot force anyone follow the guidelines and policy - but as Christians reaching out in Christian love, we offer this guidance for the good of God's people. The Church must always call people to the vision of Christ for our life together. We pray that individuals will put the well-being of others ahead of personal preference and practice sharing God's love through continuing to wear a mask if not fully vaccinated.

Through the summer months...

IN-PERSON WORSHIP SERVICES will, FOR THE SUMMER MONTHS, remain as they are, blended and with prerecorded music. There are plans to introduce some live special music pieces as we work our way through the summer and closer to Fall. We have resumed singing during worship - especially during times of singing, if you are not vaccinated we ask you to please wear a mask.

COMMUNION will continue to be offered using the pre-filled wafer/juice cups.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF SUMMER AND TRINITY'S PATIO AREA may also include opportunities for pop-up outdoor coffee hours and other small group gatherings!

GOD WILLING by September we envision NO masks, NO social distancing, LIVE music, coffee hours shared inside and . . . LOTS OF HUGS!

MAGRADY ELLIS Graduating from Kettle Moraine Lutheran High School on June 6th. Magrady is headed to North Park University in Illinois.






