Dear Children of God,

Here we are in the middle of summer. During my childhood, summer was a magical time. School was out and most days I was out playing through the whole day. Sometimes my mom would watch me run out the door and wouldn't see me again till dinnertime. Many times I spent the day playing baseball all day. Occasionally my parents even came out and played ball with us. There was such freedom and such joy.

Also in the summer there was time with family. We usually had a day we went to the zoo in Chicago or we went to an amusement park near where most of my relatives lived. We went on picnics and enjoyed just being together.

I went to my grandmother's for a week every summer and spent time with her and grandfather and great-grandmother. My cousins would come over and we would play with the child who lived next door. There was a magic and a wonder that filled the summer days.

I sometimes wonder what happened to all that, both for myself and for the world. I know I have far less of that magic in the summers now—though, on occasion it is still there in time spent with family. But it seems to pass so fast. And summer for everyone's families seem to be far more jammed with activities and places to be.

You do understand that God wants joy and play and freedom to be a part of who we are. Yes, there are calls to work and to serve, but there are also in scripture invitations to joy and freedom within our lives as well.

In 2 Samuel, David dances in joy before the Ark of the Covenant and invites the people to find joy. His wife berates him for his silliness and his vulgar display before the maids of his house, but David says, 'It was before the Lord, who chose me in place of your father and all his household, to appoint me as prince over Israel, the people of the Lord, that I have danced before the Lord'. The wise writer of Ecclesiastes says: I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live; moreover, it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil. And Jesus proclaims: I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

We as Christians believe not just in work and faithfulness but also joy and play and abundance. My hope is that you find joy in the days of summer and that we, as a congregation, create a space for joy and play and peace in our life together.





Trivity's MEMORIAL GLASS project is in excellent hands!

The Krauski family has a rich history in art glass. Bob and Mary Krauski, themselves, have been at work full time making glass art since the early '70s. Bob is the central figure of three generations of glass-making expertise. His dad, Tony, was a glass painter and their son, Peter, is a glazier employed by Oakbrook Esser Studio. Bob does the glazing here; however, he is best known for his sandblasting abilities. He has been blasting for 30 years and has thoroughly mastered the skill. He is also willing to tackle new and interesting techniques, inventing new ones of his own!

Bob and Mary's studio is located in the beautiful Kettle Moraine area of Southeastern Wisconsin, which often serves as an inspiration. The building itself is a Civil War era structure originally built to house the general store of the tiny and historic hamlet of Monches. They have done work for hospitals, nature centers, restaurants, corporations and Churches as well as hundreds of private individuals. Although a high concentration of their work has been in the Midwest, they have traveled extensively and because of our their exhibiting with such prestigious groups as the American Craft Council, they have worked in every part of the country.

The Krauski's approach their craft diligently and respectfully, always trying to devise ways to please both their clients and themselves—making every effort to create works that will stand the test of time and be passed on to future generations. krauskiartglass.com

MEMORIAL GLASS: it's a process!


BY: SANDY POENITSCH | A memorial project to have stained glass panels created, intended to replace the compromised plain glass in the double doors between the Heritage Room and the Narthex that leads into Trinity's Sanctuary, has been an ongoing process.

After several months of pursuing stained glass options and recommendations that seemed viable, but never came to fruition, we were finally led to Bob Krauski who, along with his wife, Mary, is the owner/operator of Krauski Art Glass in Hartland.

We are truly honored that Bob and Mary Krauski are the artists that will be bringing to life our art glass door panel design.

After meeting with Bob in his studio and learning more about his art—the original design proposed for our doors went through a bit of an evolution. Originally, the only color would have been in the symbol centered on each panel (reflecting Trinity's commitment as a Reconciling in Christ congregation) and in a border on the outside edge. While helping select glass for the center symbols, I was struck by the abundant, odd sized, interesting and varied types of glass in the studio—remnants from years of Krauski Art Glass projects. That same day I went home and redesigned what were originally plain glass panels surrounding the center symbols. The rework includes more of an art aspect that not only adds interest, but also allows the ability to incorporate somewhat randomly, the varied glass types and colors available using the remnant pieces within the design. Thankfully, after sharing the redesign with Bob, he agreed with the new plan!

As it goes, life events (including 2020 and COVID-19) played roles in delaying the progress, but things are back on track and Bob is in the process of working on a full-size pattern to cut the glass for our door panels! The pictures shared in this newsletter show Bob with the actual size print of the design as he makes necessary structure tweaks and starts numbering each (and every) piece needed to be cut. It will be my pleasure to be visiting the Krauski studio often (helping Bob if and as I can) and recording, through pictures, the process and progress of his work.



Due to pandemic quarantines, four of our confirmands were unable to attend CONFIRMATION 2020-PART 1 with the rest of their peers last October, and so: A celebration of Confirmation service was held for them on a very beautiful morning at Ridge Run Park on Sunday, May 23rd. There, these four young adults affirmed their baptisms in the presence of God, their families, and the Trinity congregation.






This famous quote is meant to inspire people to take action NOW— not to wait for someone else to step up. It implies that a person should find who they truly are and *use it* to change the world.
