## The Confession:

All: Eternal God: We plead guilty to those most basic sins, selfishness and pride. We often confuse that which is good and right, with that which is good FOR US. # The Gospel:

## John 8:31-41

<sup>31</sup>Then Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; <sup>32</sup> and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." <sup>33</sup>They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?"

<sup>34</sup> Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. <sup>35</sup> The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. <sup>36</sup> So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed. <sup>37</sup> I know that you are descendants of Abraham; yet you look for an opportunity to kill me, because there is no place in you for my word. <sup>38</sup> I declare what I have seen in the Father's presence; as for you, you should do what you have heard from the Father."<sup>[a]</sup>

## Jesus and Abraham

**39** They answered him, "Abraham is our father." Jesus said to them, "If you were Abraham's children, you would be doing<sup>[b]</sup> what Abraham did, **40** but now you are trying to kill me, a man who has told you the truth that I heard from God. This is not what Abraham did. **41** You are indeed doing what your father does." They said to him, "We are not illegitimate children; we have one father, God himself."
