## BEHIND The SCENES

#### THANK YOU to Phil Wagner, Bob Poenitsch and Paul Ehmke!

About 20 years ago, Paul Ehmke installed heavy, protective glass on the outside of the stained glass windows in Trinity's sanctuary. Recently, one of them (the glass on the largest, center transit window on the south side of the church) came loose and slid down a few feet. Thankfully, the glass did not break in the process (it must have been a slow slide down!). When it was discovered, Phil Wagner secured it in place with wood bracing until it could be repaired. This particular section of glass was about 10½ feet tall, banded in 3-parts. A call was made to a local glass shop to see if they could put the glass back in place for us. After looking at the situation they gave us an estimate ranging anywhere from \$850 to \$1,300 to do the work. Instead, Phil Wagner and Bob Poenitsch decided they would tackle the job themselves. After a call to Paul Ehmke, hoping he still had and could borrow-out his glass suction cup, Paul even came to share his expertise, guiding Phil and Bob (and giving them peace of mind!) as they carefully removed each section of the (very heavy) glass. Two days later they had all the materials they needed to clean and reinstall the glass.

We owe Phil, Bob *and* Paul a debt of gratitude for their dedication, skill and service to Trinity.

A little more about Phil Wagner. We are extremely blessed to have Phil Wagner on staff as Trinity's Facilities Manger. Phil's job description involves things like cleaning, setting up tables and chairs and general maintenance—but, many times, what he does goes far above and beyond anything on his job description.

He is always willing to lend a hand, in and outside the building, no matter the task! He took on replacing all our lighting with LED fixtures which is saving Trinity many dollars every day. His knowledge of the building and trouble-shooting skills over the years has gone a long way to prevent what could have been nightmare situations for us more than a few times. A few weeks ago, Phil found himself removing absolutely horrible smelly (dead) fish that one of Trinity's neighbors decided to throw in our dumpster. The odor was truly unbearable and would have only magnified had Phil not taken it upon himself to get them out (and, of course, they were at the very bottom!). That is only a small example of his dedication to working outside the lines. When you see Phil, please let him know how much his service to Trinity by way of caring, both for our property and our welfare alike, is appreciated!

# rivity's MEMORIAL GLASS: project update

BY: SANDY POENITSCH | The memorial glass project for the double doors between the Heritage Room and the Narthex and Sanctuary is well underway. I have been traveling to the Krauski Art Glass Studio weekly to help Bob Krauski with elements of the process.

Bob printed two full-size copies of the design. He had one of them numbered, so my first job was to transfer the numbers to the second printout. Once that was done I was asked to cut out each piece of the original pattern using a special scissors that leaves a channel—this allows for the copper foil and soldering that will be required to secure each piece of glass to the other. The numbering and cutting alone took almost 5 hours!

Each cut piece represents a piece of glass needed to fabricate one panel. The next task was selecting the glass remnants in the Krauski studio that we would use. A bit of spray adhesive on the back of the cut paper pieces helps hold them in plce on the glass as Bob cuts them. He then wet-sands all sides of each piece. The paper pattern is removed and each piece finds its place on top of the numbered pattern on his work table (just like a puzzle).

Just before the publication of this newsletter we had one of the glass panels completely cut and layed out. The next step is to wrap each piece in copper foil so Bob can then start the soldering process. Each door will also have steel reinforcing bars placed as well.

Once all the glass was cut and laid down on the table for the first panel, Bob slid the numbered pattern out from underneath. I will trace/transfer it on the back to reverse the pattern for the second door and number each piece again. If all goes well, next visit we will start the process all over again for the second door.

NOTE: the glass for the cross in the center is black and opague, but the rest of the glass is transluscent. The colors look darker in the photos because they are on a hard/solid surface.





































Thank you to organizers, Haley Kordosky and Alyssa Brockman for Trinity's first annual Chalk the Block! event!


