

Ramos Benito.



Kaori is now 8 years old, her birthday is February 10, 2013. She lives in the a very poor coastal community of Pueblo Joven Huascar-B (PERU) with her parents and 3 brothers. Before COVID, her father is sometimes employed as work is available. Her mother is not employed. Kaori helps her family by cleaning around the home.

As we can only imagine, the global pandemic has significantly impacted the community where Kaori lives and has also interrupted the normal contact we have had with Kaori through Compassion International. Prior to COVID, common health problems in the area where Kaori is growing up include anemia, acute respiratory infections, tuberculosis, diabetes and osteoporosis. Most adults work as street vendors, bricklayers or in domestic services and earn the equivalent of \$170 per month.

We ask for your continued prayers and support for Kaori and her family and will keep you informed as we receive updates about them.

Church should be a place of abundance: an abundance of caring, an abundance of welcoming, an abundance of forgiveness, an abundance of action. The Project RETURN donations have certainly been abundant! Trinity's latest load not only filled up a van, it also filled the Project RETURN donations room to the brim!

As **Project RETURN** currently has reduced office hours and staff, they have asked us to concentrate more on these types of priority items:

- Personal hygiene products (such as Soap, Shampoo, Conditioner, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Deodorant, Razor, Hairbrush/ Comb, Washcloths, Feminine Hygiene Products, Shaving Cream, Toenail Clippers, Chap stick, Lotion, etc.)
- Gift cards (Walmart, Target, Kohls, Pick-n-Save, Dollar Tree etc. or just a visa gift card they may use to pay cell phone bill or buy a bus card)
- Blankets, pillows, bedding.
- Small kitchen appliances such as microwaves, toasters, etc.

Project RETURN is in the early stages of creating a housing facility for those returning from incarceration who do not have a place to go. They hope to have housing items gathered ahead of time. What they are looking for will change as their plans move forward and I'll be sure to keep everyone updated.
