Dear Trinity family and friends,

The theme this month is *thanksgiving; remembering the gifts we have received.*

November begins with celebration of "All Saints". We remember the gift of the saints in our lives who raised us in our baptismal identity. We remember the saints who were the signs, and even more the embodiment, of the love of Christ in our lives. 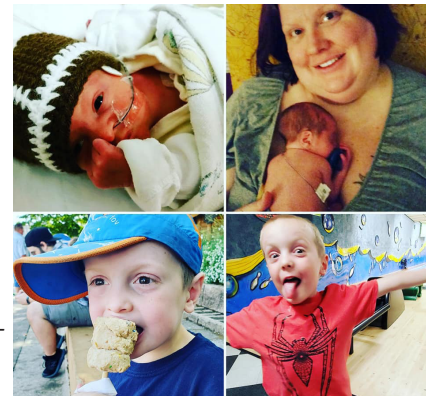

Evander and Tiffany Wilson's son, John, spent the first month of his life in the NICU at Children's Wisconsin. During that time, the Ronald McDonald House gave Evander and Tiffany a place to call home. They could sleep right across the street from their newborn son - instead of an hour away in Campbellsport.



The Ronald McDonald House (RMHC) provides a "home away from home" for families while their children are receiving medical treatment at local hospitals. RMHC's mission is to keep families together and promote the health and well-being of children. # MORE THAN MONEY.

IT'S ABOUT

FROM PAUL BAUMAN, TRINITY TREASURER

As the Treasurer, I help monitor Trinity's receipts and expenditures with our Finance Team. **But as a church member it is about so much more than money coming in and going out.** *Let me explain.* As I once heard from a national church president, *money is meant to be our servant.* It is the way we express what's important to us. **You might say it shows what we value.**

As I see it at Trinity, money is one of the ways we express our mission statement, *sharing the love and promise of God.* All four areas of ministry-- worship, building up, reaching out, and staff and property are focused on this mission that we proclaim is what we are all about. And as a congregation we become managers, or stewards, using our gifts to make our vision a reality. **We use our money to serve this important purpose rather than becoming slaves to our possessions.** In baptism, we are joined to Christ. He promises to love and forgive us, but also calls us to be His followers. **We are set free from the worlds claims on our gifts. Instead, we are called to use those gifts with one another in service to Christ in the world.** Our calling is to reflect Jesus in our life journey as stewards or managers of what we been allowed to have. We view our life as gift. We follow Jesus in giving all we have and are for the sake of the world. Trinity is a community of the baptized. As a baptized Christian I see such hope in how the money given by the baptized at Trinity does ministry and fulfills our mission. Together, our gifts are doing ministry at Trinity, in our community and beyond—to all corners of this globe.

**We have been fortunate as a congregation.** Sharing our gifts has kept things going at Trinity, *though recently things have been tight.* We appear to be, where Trinity has often been, not quite where we *should be,* but managing until year end—just giving and sharing.

**What can we do in 2022?** The budget process has started. Our 10 ministry teams are completing their 2022 budget requests. The Finance Team: Parish Clerk Ruth MacDonald, Jackie Granger, David Putnam, Pastor Dave, and myself, will be preparing a proposed budget for our Congregation Council's consideration in December. Then it will be presented for your consideration at our Annual Meeting in January. **All of us together are dreaming of the new possibilities for God's kingdom as we come out of the difficult time the world has faced.** We have been set free by God's grace to share our gifts so that the work of Christ continues to grow in the world.

So as the treasurer, I invite you to see it is as more than giving money to keep Trinity going. Rather, it is a part of your dream for the things Christ can do **through us.** It is about our identity as the baptized and stewards of both time and money, working together as servants in ministry, fulfilling Trinity's mission: **"sharing the love and promise of God".** *What could that look like?* In the words of St. Augustine, **"Faith is believing what you do not see; the reward of faith is seeing what you believe."**

Project RETURN grew out of a volunteer base that believed men and women returning from incarceration deserved a second chance. It offers a variety of support for those returning from incarceration.

Project RETURN has asked us to concentrate more on these types of priority items:

- Personal hygiene products (such as Soap, Shampoo, Conditioner, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Deodorant, Razor, Hairbrush/ Comb, Washcloths, Feminine Hygiene Products, Shaving Cream, Toenail Clippers, Chap stick, Lotion, etc.)
- Gift cards (Walmart, Target, Kohls, Pick-n-Save, Dollar Tree etc. or just a visa gift card they may use to pay cell phone bill or buy a bus card)
- Blankets, pillows, bedding.
- Small kitchen appliances such as microwaves, toasters, etc.

**The Mitten and Giving Trees** are also coming soon—this is one way we can brighten the hearts of folks who may be struggling during the holiday season.
























**25TH ANNIVERSARY COIN DRIVE**

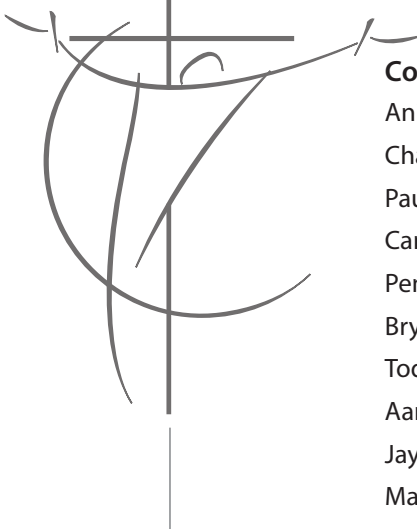
