Dear, Dear, Family of God:

As I write this letter we have once again celebrated the birthday of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Every year I love re-hearing his eloquent, faith grounded and driven vision of a possible future. But it saddens me to realize how little progress we have made.

We are living dark times. Between Covid, racial and political divides, and the actual normal February cold and darkness, it is easy to feel exhausted and disheartened. However, in this - the Epiphany season of Trinity's Centennial year - I have found Dr. King's observations on darkness particularly helpful.

Midnight is a confusing hour, and one in which it is difficult to be faithful; but the relevancy and power of the church will be measured by its capacity to meet the needs of those who come at midnight. The most inspiring word that the church can say to people at midnight is that no midnight is here to stay. Midnight is only a temporary development in the cycle of life's day.

Yes, the dawn will come. Disappointment, sorrow and despair are all born in midnight, but we may be consoled by the fact that morning will come. "Weeping may stay for a night," says the Psalmist, "but joy comes in the morning." This is the faith that will adjourn the assemblies of hopelessness, and bring new light into the dark chambers of pessimism.

We have not been able to move into our Centennial year with all the celebration for which we hoped. We are uncertain what the future holds. But we can be positive that God's message of hope, new beginnings and new life has never been more needed or relevant. We - the church - are called to carry the light of God's love into the darkness and let it shatter old patterns of hatred and fear.

Soon we will start seeing Valentines' Day decorations. Let them remind us to celebrate God's deepest love which shatters every darkness. In the words of Dr. King: We stand in life at midnight; we are always at the threshold of a new dawn.

May God's light, love, hope and peace be with you all,

1922-2022 100 Years

Seeds to Share God's love and promise were planted 100 years ago.

In the spring of 1922, a small group of Lutheran men and women began meeting in a rented room over Poull's Department Store (now the old Ziegler Company building). Field Missionary Reverend William Stump traveled to West Bend every weekend to conduct services there and to visit the homes of Lutheran families. It was the only church in West Bend where services were conducted in English vs German.

On September 19, 1922, twelve Lutherans met with Pastor Stump in the home of one of the members and took action to call a permanent Pastor. Reverend Paul Wetzler became the first pastor of our church in February of 1923. On April 1, 1923, the charter was closed with a total of 49 members.

At the first congregational meeting on May 4, 1923, with a membership of 47 voting members (26 families), the purchase of the lot on which our church now stands was authorized and a building committee appointed. In July of 1923, the mezzanine floor of the Masonic Temple was rented in order to hold Sunday services and conduct Sunday School classes.

The building committee was authorized to proceed with the construction of the church on July 18, 1926. Membership at the time was 43 families consisting of 88 members. The church was completed in December of 1926 with the first service held December 12, 1926.

In December of 1932, our pipe organ was purchased and first played at the Christmas Eve services.



Mid-Century Expansion Consideration toward acquiring a new church site on the former Johann farm property (where the YMCA is now located) began in 1952. In the end however, they chose to expand the original with building **construction** starting in October of 1956.

Dedication to the newly expanded church took place on November 17, 1957.

On January 19, 1959, the official name became Trinity Lutheran Church.

## It's all TOO MUCH.

If this looks familiar, it is because it was shared once before, in one of Trinity's mid-week Email blasts about half way through last year. Considering that many of us are struggling with all the set backs and anxiety that come with yet another COVID surge—'thought this was worth another visit. And because, no matter how overwhelming everyting can seem, there is hope and light knowing we can all still make a difference in ways we are each called.

#### If you can't take it anymore, there's a reason.

An essay on circuit breakers, empty buckets, and the shame-show of social media. Written by Nadia Bolz-Weber, an ordained Lutheran Pastor, founder of House for All Sinners & Saints in Denver, CO and the author of three NYT bestselling memoirs.

#### It's all too much.

I used to live in a very old apartment building with super sketchy electrical wiring. Were I too audaciously assume my hair drier could run while my stereo was on, I would once again find myself opening the grey metal fuse box next to the refrigerator and flipping the breaker. My apartment had been built at a time when there were no electric hair driers, and the system shut down when modernity asked too much of it.

I think of that fuse box often these days, because friends, I just do not think our psyches were developed to hold, feel and respond to everything coming at them right now; every tragedy, injustice, sorrow and natural disaster happening to every human across the entire planet, in real time every minute of every day. The human heart and spirit were developed to be able to hold, feel and respond to any tragedy, injustice, sorrow or natural disaster that was happening IN OUR VILLAGE.

## So my emotional circuit breaker keeps overloading because the hardware was built for an older time.

And yet, when I check social media it feels like there are voices saying "if you aren't talking about, doing something about, performatively posting about <u>(fill in the blank)</u> then you are an irredeemably callous, privileged, bigot who IS PART OF THE PROBLEM." Because I am someone who does actually care about human suffering and injustice (someone who feels every picture I see, and story I read), those commetns leaves me feeling absolutely awful. I am left with wondering: **am I doing enough, saving enough about all the horrible things right now to think of myself as a good person and subsequently silence the accusing voice in my head?** No. The answer is always no. No I am not. Nor could I. Because no matter what I do, the goal of "enough" is just as far as when I started.

#### And yet doing nothing is hardly the answer.

So I wanted to share something with you. Every day of my life I ask myself three discernment questions I learned from one of my teachers, Suzanne Stabile: What's MINE to do, and what's NOT mine to do? What's MINE to say and what's NOT mine to say? And the third one is harder: What's MINE to care about and what's NOT mine to care about?

To be clear – that is not to say that it is not worthy to be cared about by **SOMEONE**, only that my effectiveness in the world cannot extend to every worthy to be cared about event and situation. It's not an issue of values, it's an issue of *MATH*.\* | \*/ know this is a complicated thing, because there are injustices that have only been addressed because, for the first time, they have become widely known through social media At the same time, I can't help but feel like the wiring in our brains and psyches and hearts and spirits wasn't meant to take in all the information we consume each day.

So I try to remember, **1**. We are still living through a global pandemic and that means the baseline of anxiety and grief is higher than ever and shared by everyone. **2**. The world is on fire literally and metaphorically. But **3**. I only have so much water in my bucket to help with the fires. The more exposure I have to the fires, the less water I have to fight and the more likely I am to get so burned, and inhale so much smoke that I cannot help anymore with the fires close enough to fight even once my bucket is full again.

So I try and tell myself that it's okay to focus on ONE fire. It's ok to do what is YOURS to do. Say what's YOURS to say. Care about what's YOURS to care about.

#### That's enough.

If immigration reform is yours to do, if it is the fire you have water to throw on, (thank you! and...) that is enough. There will be voices saying *"but what about climate change? You don't care that the planet is dying?"* Tune that stuff out. I mean, you could turn around and ask the environmentalist next door why they heartlessly don't care about immigrants, but there is no percentage in that. *Instead, we could be so grateful for the people who are called to work on and respond to worthy issues that are not fires we ourselves are equipped to put out.* 

I'm not saying we should put our heads in the sand, I'm saying that if your circuits are overwhelmed there's a reason—and the reason isn't because you are heartless, it's because **there is not a human heart on this** planet that can bear all of what it happening right now. So thank you for being a person who cares about and responds to animals, or the environment, or immigration, or domestic violence, or any of the other worthy-to-be-cared-about horror stories we are in the midst of right now. Just, *thank you*.

### LOOKING AHEAD TO THE SEASON OF

Currently, we are in the church season of **Epiphany**, which runs from January 6th until **Ash Wednesday**—when the season of Lent begins.

Ash Wednesday falls on March 2nd this year. Its official name is "Day of Ashes," so called because of the practice of rubbing ashes on one's forehead in the sign of the cross as these words are repeated, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." ECCLESIASTES 3:20

Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.

At Trinity there will be a number of special worship opportunities during the Lenten Season, *here are some*:

- Ash Wednesday | MARCH 2
   Worship at NOON and 6:30 PM
- Palm/Passion Worship | APRIL 9/10 SATURDAY | 3:30 PM SUNDAY | 9:30 AM
- Maundy Thursday | APRIL 14 Worship at NOON *and* 6:30 PM
- Good Friday | APRIL 15
   Worship at NOON and 7:30 PM

#### KEEPING THE PROMISE rotation starts FEB 13th

**KEEPING THE PROMISE** is a special rotation presented within Trinity's Children's Ministry program every year. It is made up of five workshops especially designed to help each grade level develop a deeper understanding of one aspect of the promise their parents made for them at their baptisms.

#### This rotation is designed directly from the baptismal vows:

In Christian love you have presented this child for Holy Baptism. You should, therefore, faithfully bring him/her to the services of God's house, and teach him/her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments. As he/she grows in years, you should place in his/her hands the Holy Scriptures and provide for his/her instruction in the Christian faith, that, living in the covenant of their Baptism and in communion with the Church, he/she may lead a godly life until the day of Jesus Christ.

#### For five weeks each 3 year old– 6th Grader will be exposed to five different presentations of the baptismal focus for their grade level:

- 3 yo-Kindergarten | Baptism/Prayer/The Church
- 1st Grade | The Lord's Prayer
- 2nd Grade | The Ten Commandments
- 3rd Grade | The Books of the Bible
- 4th Grade | The Apostle's Creed
- 5th Grade | Worship and Communion
- 6th Grade | The Lord's Prayer

#### Parent/Guardians: YOUR PARTICIPATION VITAL

#### Dear Parents/Guardians,

To be fully successful, this rotation requires that each child's loved ones discuss their topics and work with them to learn the material. **KEEPING THE PROMISE** begins with the presentation of Bibles to the 3rd Graders on February 13th. For the 5th Graders, **KEEPING THE PROMISE** includes First Communion workshops (with their parents) on Friday and Saturday, February 18th and 19th, and their First Communion received during worship on Sunday, March 6th.

This important 5-week rotation requires extra work on the part of the shepherds, rotation leaders and parents—but it is our attempt to faithfully "keep the promise" we all made to God and our children.


