Our Confession:

All: Creator God, we forget the relationship we have with you. We forget that you make a claim on us. We reverse the roles and make demands on you. We do not ask often enough for you to give us strength for hardships as we seek to live out our witness in the world. We are not wrong to petition you for things we need, but we are wrong to expect you always to make our way smooth. We do not look for the spiritual growth in the roadblocks we face. Forgive us for expecting you to do things our way. Teach us to

expect hardships and to see your hand in them. Move us to accept the claim you make on us. In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.

Words of Assurance:

Leader: The God who created us will not abandon us. God is with us in our struggles, including our struggle with sin. God offers mercy to forgive and power to grow. In the name of Jesus the Christ we claim God's grace.

Confession Response: With Kindness (music at end of bulletin)

The Reading: Hebrews 2:14-18 (The Message)

This scripture reading suggests an understanding of the Jewish sacrificial system requiring human action to make wrong actions right with God. Here the writer says the human Jesus, identified as Savior, did this for all of humanity through His death destroying both the power of death and the devil.

Since the children are made of flesh and blood, it's logical that the Savior took on flesh and blood in order to rescue them by his death. By embracing death, taking it into himself, he destroyed the Devil's hold on death and freed all who cower through life, scared to death of death.

It's obvious, of course, that he didn't go to all this trouble for angels. It was for people like us, children of Abraham. That's why he had to enter into every detail of human life. Then, when he came before God as high priest to get rid of the people's sins, he would have already experienced it all himself—all the pain, all the testing—and would be able to help where help was needed.

THE GOSPEL: Luke 2:22-40

Here is an incident in Jesus' early life journey where He is brought to the Jerusalem temple by His parents for the Jewish Rite of Purification. Two older people, Simeon and Anna, see in this event, involving the infant Jesus, a person with a far greater future affecting the life of many others.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace,

according to your word;

for my eyes have seen your salvation,

which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.
