CALL TO WORSHIP:

Leader: God invites us into the holy realm of salvation.

People: We come, but we come with many questions.

Leader: God welcomes us with all our fears and doubts.

People: We admit that we do have many doubts and fears.

Leader: God's love conquers all, even when doubts remain.

People: Trusting this promise, we come.

OUR CONFESSION:

Leader: Let us confess to God and before one another our sins, and especially our unwillingness to confront our own questions and fears.

People: We confess to you, O God, and before one another that we have sinned. We want to believe, but we find it hard. There are so many questions about the Bible and about life. We want you to reassure

us that we are on the right track, but we are afraid of our own questions. Sometimes we fear what the answer might be; sometimes we fear because we know what the answer is; and sometimes we fear because we think there may not be an answer. Come into our presence once again and still our fears. Fill us with the courage that comes from knowing you as the God who is love. Amen.

Leader: God is indeed love and is greater than our fears. Receive God's peace, as God receives us with all our questions and fears.

CONFESSION RESPONSE: Break These Chains (music at end of bulletin)

THE READING: Acts 5:27-32

Acts is the biblical book on life in the early church after Jesus' death, resurrection, and the coming of the Holy Spirit. This incident takes place when believers were being arrested and persecuted. Here Peter, and some of the others, were brought before the Jewish Council and reminded what they were commanded not to do. Peter witnesses to what God has done for them and that he and others must obey God rather than men.

When they had brought them, they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us.' But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior, so that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.'

THE GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

Here the Gospel of John has the story of two post-resurrection appearances of Jesus to His disciples, At the first one Thomas is absent and suggests that he does not believe their witness of Jesus being alive. The second time Thomas is there and Jesus invites him to touch where He had been wounded resulting in an utterance by Thomas of belief. Some say what follows about the book being written for our belief may have been the original ending to this book.

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to

them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.' Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
