Dear Trinity Family and Friends,

It was amazing to gather in church on Easter Sunday and see so many present. There was excitement and joy and it almost seemed to be back to normal. After two long years we could finally gather in person to cry together, "Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!"

Then we began to think and realized, that for Christians, normal is a concept that does not fit. We as Christians never really expect the world to be normal. Normal is for people to die and stay dead—but the power of death was shattered with Easter. We rejoice in that which is unexpected and new.

When we least expect it we are called in the world to make a difference. Look at the movement of our congregation. We are constantly expanding our ministry to ever new places and needs. The adult day care that was once housed in our lower level moved on, and we were called instead to make a place for the children of the West Bend area. When many years ago we considered the needs of the community, we never would have expected homelessness to be one of the biggest problems in the community and Family Promise was born. And now recently we have found ourselves reaching out to the prison population and considering how to work with congregations in Milwaukee in new ways. We are working to support the people of Ukraine. Our welcome statement is calling us to make ever wider the circle of God's love. We are building new relationships constantly and working in ever new ways to "Share the love and promise of God," with everyone.

We have begun celebrating 100 years as a congregation, and when you think about it, this congregation has always been being called to something new and different. There has never been a *normal* way of doing ministry. The only thing that remains constant is the love of God that comes in the life, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Normal? When compared with the rest of the world, Christians have never been normal. One of the most interesting charges leveled against the early church was recorded in the book of Acts:

These people have turned the rest of the world upside down . . . ACTS 17:6

Don't settle for normal. Let us follow those who have gone before in turning the world upside for the next 100 years.














CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

How do we face unexpected struggles in life? How do we find joy and hope in the midst of illness and uncertainty? We hear a unique perspective from Jeannie Gaffigan, wife of comedian Jim Gaffigan in her book, When Life Gives You Pears: The Healing Power of Family, Faith, and Funny People.

The following synopsis is found on the Amazon website: In 2017, Jeannie's life came to a crashing halt when she was diagnosed with a life-threatening brain tumor. As the mother of 5 kids —6 if you include her husband— sat in the neurosurgery department in star-covered sweats too whimsical for the seriousness of the situation, all she could think was "Am I going to die?" Thankfully, Jeannie and her family were able to survive their time of crisis, and now she is sharing her deeply personal journey through this miraculous story: the challenging conversations she had with her children; how she came to terms with feeling powerless and ferociously crabby while bedridden and unable to eat for a month; and how she ultimately learned, re-learned and re re-learned to be more present in life. With sincerity and hilarity, Jeannie invites you into her heart (and brain) during this trying time, emphasizing the importance of family, faith and humor as keys to her recovery and leading a more fulfilling life.
