FINANCIAL MINIS RY 6 MONTHS INTO 2022

Trinity's Financial Ministry enables and empowers what we can do together every year — *as a congregation and a Christian community also related to the ELCA and Greater Milwaukee Synod, and other outreach ministries.*

Because our building *(post-covid closure)* is being used much more, our staff has expanded and is being better compensated, naturally expenses have gone up. Trinity's Financial Ministry Team meets monthly to monitor income and expenses; and I can report to you that at this mid-year point we are doing okay.

- An anonymous **gift of \$50,000 to our Endowment Fund** was very gratefully received. Endowment Fund *earnings* are used specifically for special outreach ministries, leadership development, or the mission of the greater church.
- Thanks to foresight and pre-planning, we had adequate funds in our Capital Fund to cover the \$60,000 cost for the much needed resurfacing of our parking lot—eliminating the need for a special drive before having the work done. This expenditure, however, has reduced our Capital Fund reserve. In thankgiving for our new parking lot, if you are able, we invite you to help us renew the Capital Fund by designating special gifts on your offering envelope to the Capital/Building Fund. Thank you in advance for your gifts toward this effort.
- The "OTHER" category of our offering envelopes designates special gifts (over and above our general fund) to support Family Promise, Ukraine, Kaori—our Compassionate International child, our Centennial, and our Youth programs. Thank you, your special gifts help enable these ministries.

I believe we are a people who experience a giving God, especially in Jesus, and are called to be a giving and sharing people. I end with what I heard recently from a new member, *"I like it that for every dollar I give, ten cents goes toward the ministry and outreach of our synod and greater church."* As a member of many congregations over the years, *not many do that*, but Trinity does. **Thank you—your faithful giving makes a difference in many ways.**

I look forward to the second half of 2022—our Centennial Year!

Project RETURN grew out of a volunteer base that believed men and women returning from incarceration deserved a second chance. It offers a variety of support for those returning from incarceration.


Project RETURN has asked us to concentrate our efforts toward some of the most needed items, *such as:*
