


So in this month's celebration, take a breath, rest, rejoice and give thanks—and get ready to leap into the next hundred years! We are blessed, after all, to be a blessing.


















As Trinity begins its second century, remember with joy and thanksgiving that God is a God of new beginnings. We are an Easter people!

- Kitchen Table & Chairs



We are coming up to November—a time we are asked to pledge our support to the work of Trinity for the upcoming year. Where do your weekly offerings go here at Trinity? Below is a general overview of the things your donations support.

First, if you want to make a donation to a specific ministry, program or fund here at Trinity, all requests designated on the offering envelopes as "OTHER SPECIFY" are honored.

Donations listed as "CURRENT" on the offering envelopes support the core GENERAL FUND and are used to support ministries and sustain our <u>entire church</u> for things such as:

- PASTORS & STAFF: Salaries/compensation.
- WORSHIP: The cost of producing bulletins, purchasing music, candles, communion supplies, maintenance and/or repair costs for our sound system, organ, piano—and more.
- **BUILDING UP:** Here your offerings are used to support special programs like Youth Ministry which includes our High School Group, Confirmation, Children's Ministry and F.I.S.H. programs—and more.
- GENERAL OFFICE: Maintenance and/or repairs to our copier, paper, envelopes, postage, computers, printers, ink, software and support, literature rack publications—and more..
- **PROPERTY:** The cost of utilities, insurance, maintenance of furnaces, air conditioners, elevator, tools, paint, and cleaning supplies. Landscaping supplies, the ever *popular* cost of snow removal—*and more*.

Ten percent of Trinity's core **GENERAL FUND** donations go to support the greater church through the ELCA's General Mission. We will share more about what the ELCA's General Mission does next month.
