According to singer-songwriter Bob Dylan:
Come gather 'round people, wherever you roam
And admit that the waters around you have grown
And accept it that soon you'll be drenched to the bone
If your time to you is worth saving
Then you better start swimmin' or you'll sink like a stone
For the times, they are a-changin'\*

The times they are changing. They are changing at Trinity as well. The question is, will we change with those times?

At a recent workshop held by the synod's RIC (*Reconciling in Christ*) team, Rev. Clara Christopher talked about the fact that many of us are traumatized. We are traumatized by re-entering the world after being closed away—a world that demands just as much or even more from us then it did before Covid—and many of us are having a tough time catching up and living in this new reality. We are traumatized.

Many are traumatized daily by the cruelty of a world that will not accept them for who they are, whether it be because of political stance or color or language or gender identity or sexual identity or age or whatever. Every day is a struggle. In a way this is not a big change—but what is changed is that we are more aware of the pain and struggle others face.

We are traumatized by economic difficulties and the world situation. Every day is filled with new and sometimes frightening realities.

And so the Church needs to change. It needs to be a place that meets people in the midst of the trauma and offers hope and life. Pastor Cris has often used the image that the Church needs to become less like a shiny bright hospital where people come to be fixed, and much more like a M\*A\*S\*H unit where everyone pitches in with whatever gifts they have to care for the needs of the hurting within and outside of its walls. In the midst of a wounded world we are called to trauma ministry.

These times call the Church to embrace new tools and new ways of being. But strangely enough, we are called to a mission that has always been our mission—to share the love and promise and hope of Christ by loving the world in the name of the Lord.

We invite you to join us in this mission, because everyone is needed. The joy is that in entering the work we find healing for our own traumas in the love of Christ.

Most people who have been around Trinity for a while know that we are at the time of year when we hold our annual commitment process. You should have received a letter and Estimate of Giving card for 2023. There have been some questions however that we want to take some time to answer here.

- Why are pledges for the coming year important? They are most important on a personal level for each of us who makes a commitment. If we do not have a vision for our commitment to the congregation it can easily get lost in the midst of all the other things that call for our resources. When we believe in this ministry and make it a priority—our commitment reminds ourselves of the significance and importance of this part of our life.
- It also aids the congregation as the leadership plans for the coming year. It helps give us an idea of the commitment of the people who are a part of Trinity's life. It is not all we use to plan for the future, but it helps us think about the resources we may have.
- How confidential is this information? No one knows what is on these cards other than the pastors and the one who enters the figures in the computer. These individuals understand the importance of confidentiality and protect it.
- What if I can't keep my commitment? All of us run into changes in our life. Things get in the way of our hopes and dreams. We as the people of God understand this reality. If you need to change the commitment you make—we understand. Just let one of the pastors know and they will make the adjustment in our files.
- Can I give electronically? Yes. The information is on the back of the Estimate of Giving cards and on our website, or you can contact the office for instructions.
- How do I return my commitment card? You are invited to bring your card forward during worship on Consecration Weekend, November 19 and 20, to be blessed for the work of Christ. If you cannot attend that week, you may mail or bring your card to the church office.

If you have any other questions or concerns, please do not be afraid to ask one of the pastors or the members of the Stewardship Team: Suzanne Barker or Peter Nelson. Each of us has our place in the **NEXT**100 years of Trinity's ministry.


### **And About the Carpet**

An appeal letter went out at the end of August asking people to contribute toward the cost of replacing some of the carpeting throughout the church that has reached the end of its life. The work has been more complicated to pull together than originally expected.

The Council has been struggling with specifics and expectations over the last few months. It has been decided that the project will be done in two phases. The lower level carpeting and flooring in the Fellowship Hall and hallway is being replaced now and the upstairs (Heritage Room) will be done sometime after the first of the year.

The cost of the whole project is estimated at \$52,000. We hope that our building is important to many of you and that you would be willing to help defray the cost. If you can make a contribution to this improvement project in addition to your normal offering, please place your gift in an envelope marked "CARPETING." Any gift toward this effort would be greatly appreciated.

We will keep you up to date on the progress of the work and the amount we have received toward its completion.

Living gratefully helps us be more resilient, grow from trauma and protect ourselves against burnout. It also boosts motivation and performance and helps build character—making us more likely to offer help others, to be more trusting and trustworthy.

With all of these benefits to practicing gratitude, your next question is probably "How do I do it?"

There are infinite ways to show our gratitude to others, to ourselves and to God. However, it can be tough to get started without practical ideas. To help grow your gratitude muscle to truly become more grateful, try by starting with this effective gratitude challenge:

Each day, name three new things that you're grateful for. No repeats and no skipped days. On days when you can't think of three things, dig deep. That's the best time to truly flex that muscle and to teach your brain to find the small stuff.

Let November be the excuse to cultivate and practice abundant gratitude.














## **BIBLE STUDY TUESDAYS**Join us as we study the word of God together Tuesday's at 1 PM
