THE CONFESSION:

P: We gather this joyous and blessed day in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you and worthily magnify your holy name, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen. (Silence for reflection)

P: An old story,

- C: A familiar story, a beloved story. Jesus is born in a stable. The angels sing. The shepherds come to worship. Today I feel as if I were there! Hearing the music, seeing the light -- marveling at the birth. Because it is not just there; it's here and now. Jesus is born! The world rejoices! Lord, forgive me when I lose myself in the cares of the world and the promises of the world. Forgive me when I lose sight of the Christ. Remind me of the joy, the love of that long ago day which is also for me this day and every day. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.
- P: In the mercy of almighty God, Jesus was born to die for us and for his sake God forgives all our sins. By the birth of God's Son, we are given the power to be born as children of God and we are given the gift of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

THE FIRST LESSON: Luke 2:1-20

¹In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3All went to their own towns to be registered. 4Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. 5He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. 6While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. 7And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. 8In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. 9Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12 This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, 14"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!" ¹⁵When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." 16So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; 18 and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. ¹⁹But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. 20The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.
