#### Happy New Year to Everyone Reading this Letter,

Normally the pastors' letter reflects the musings of both Cris and I, but this month I am striking out on my own. New Years is always exciting for me. It begins with our wedding anniversary, and how can that be anything but wonderful?! It is a time to take stock of all the wonderful things that have touched me in the last year. *By the way all of you are a part of those wonderful things*.

But what bothers me is that the world does not always seem to be so *new*. Some would remind me that it is new. We have conquered so many problems. We have amazing medicine and the quality of living is better for most of the world. *I bow to such wisdom*.

But what does not seem to ever change is the human reality of brokenness that seems to pervade the world. We continue to fight wars and kill one another. We continue to treat others who are different with prejudice and sometimes even hatred and contempt. We prioritize our own needs and lives at the expense of others. Refugees are kept out, the hungry continue to starve, the rich expand their wealth, the poor lose ground, and the homeless remain cold and alone. We deny we are broken and refuse to consider changes because, well, it all seems impossible. *Sometimes I wonder if we can change at all.* 

**Yet Jesus calls all this into question.** His disciples were shocked by the demand Jesus makes on a rich person. Jesus invites him to give all he has away and follow Jesus in his ministry. I am sure we would balk as well. *How can anyone do such a thing?* 

Here is Jesus' response: 'For mortals it is impossible, but for God all things are possible.'

I keep returning to that idea. Jesus can make us as individuals new—for nothing is *impossible to God*. During the holidays Cris and Nick and I went to the movie Spirited. It is kind of a retelling of a Christmas Carol. One of the most powerful messages of the movie is that we may not change miraculously all at once—but we can be *new*, one small act at time. In the same way, we can also work to change what appears to be an unchanging world—one small act at a time.

May we be made new in this New Year and continue to work to change the world on small act at a time. For with God nothing is impossible.

# Small gift bag. BIG impact.

## Breaking the Chains Church (BtCC) Gift Bags

**Thank you** to everyone who donated bags of chips for the **Breaking the Chains Church (BtCC)** gift bags put together for the men and staff at two correctional centers we work with.

#### Each gift bag contained:

about 4 beef sticks, 2 bags of chips, a package of cheese and peanut butter crackers, a granola bar, a stick of deodorant, a bottle of body soap, 2 stamped envelopes with blank Christmas cards in them, and a couple of peppermint candies.

The Christmas gift bags were delivered to the men about a week before Christmas. At the next worship service, men who normally don't show up for worship came by beforehand just to say thank you and tell us how much they appreciated the gift bags. You know, for most of these men that gift bag is the only Christmas gift they'll see, the only thing that makes Christmas day something other than just another day.

We asked some of the men what their favorite item in the gift bag was. One said, the peppermint candy, because it reminded him of his grandmother. Another said, the cards and envelopes. He said he sent one to his mother and the other to his auntie— without those cards he'd wouldn't have had anything to send to them. Another man said his favorite thing was everything! And a number of others said they appreciated the deodorant, which is an item that is not always easy for them to come by.

I thought I'd pass along a little theology one of the men shared at the end of the worship service. At the end of worship he said, *"I have something to say."* Then he looked at every man sitting round that table, the incarcerated and the unincarcerated and said, *"Don't let no one say you're not good because you been incarcerated or because of the mistakes you made. God made you and when God makes something it's good. So don't let no one ever tell you you're not. Don't you listen to them."* 

A small gift bag had a big impact. Many of the men were surprised that there were people out there that care about them at all. Please keep these men in your prayers throughout the year.





From the back of the book we find the description: Jesus and John Wayne is a sweeping account that reveals how some American Evangelicals have worked for decades to replace the Jesus of the Gospels with an image of rugged masculinity and Christian Nationalism.

#### **3** March's book will be <u>The First Paul</u> by Marcus Borg and John Domonic Crossan. MARCH BOOK STUDY DISCUSSION DATE | TBA

Crossan and Borg—two of the world's top-selling Christian scholars and the bestselling authors of The Last Week and The First Christmas—once again shake up the status quo by arguing that the message of the apostle Paul, considered by many to be the second most important figure in Christianity, has been domesticated by the church. Borg and Crossan turn the common perception of Paul on its head, revealing him as a radical follower of Jesus whose core message is still relevant today.
