## THE READING: 1 Corinthians 3:1-9

The Apostle Paul, writing to this young congregation in Corinth of Greece, addresses the favoritism which some are expressing about him and Apollos. He reminds them that they are all part of Christian community and have different roles within it.

And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people but rather as fleshly, as infants in Christ. <sup>2</sup> I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, <sup>3</sup> for you are still fleshly. For as long as there is jealousy and quarreling<sup>[a]</sup> among you, are you not fleshly and behaving according to human inclinations? <sup>4</sup> For when one says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not all too human?

<sup>5</sup> What then is Apollos? What is Paul? Servants through whom you came to believe, as the Lord assigned to each. <sup>6</sup> I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth. <sup>7</sup> So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth. <sup>8</sup> The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and each will receive wages according to their own labor. <sup>9</sup> For we are God's coworkers, working together; you are God's field, God's building.

# THE GOSPEL: Matthew 5:21-27

This is another part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount shared with His disciples or followers. He contrasts what they previously heard about how they should behave with what He suggests they now show to others.

"You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder,' and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' <sup>22</sup> But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, [a] you will be liable to judgment, and if you insult [b] a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council, and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the

hell<sup>[c]</sup> of fire. <sup>23</sup> So when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, <sup>24</sup> leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother or sister, and then come and offer your gift. <sup>25</sup> Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are on the way to court<sup>[d]</sup> with him, or your accuser may hand you over to the judge and the judge to the guard, and you will be thrown into prison. <sup>26</sup> Truly I tell you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.
