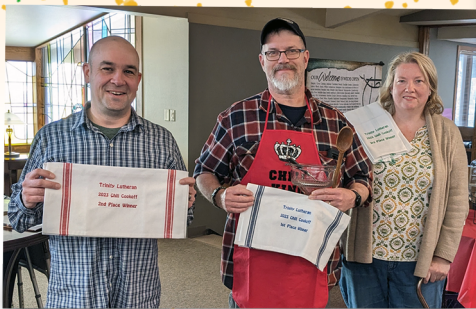

AN INVITATION TO THE TRINITY CONGREGATION FROM

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

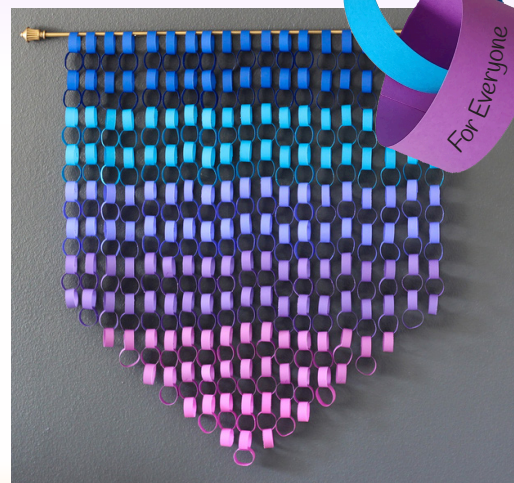
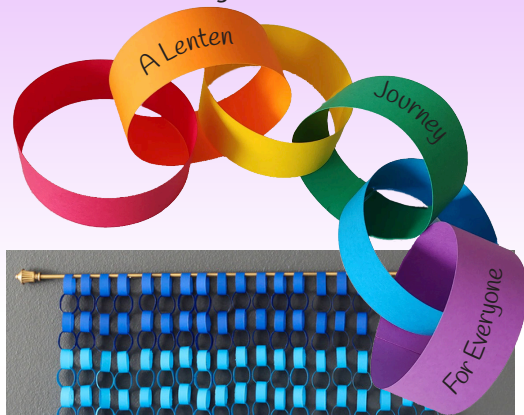
It may be something like, saying a prayer every day for something or someone they know, or maybe to ask for forgiveness.

It might be giving up something they like to do so they understand what fasting and sacrifice mean.

Or, it could be doing something nice (acts of kindness) for others at school or at home.

Writing down this intentional act each week offers ways for our children to think about and experience the season of Lent beyond Sunday mornings and in tangible ways.

As the acts are recorded and the colored paper strips accumulate, they will be formed into chain links that will create an attractive wall hanging for all to see in the Heritage Room!



You're invited!

Children's Ministry invites the Trinity congregation to join them in this journey by recording your own weekly intentions during Lent!

Look for strips of colored paper in the Heritage Room and write down your Lenten focus for the coming week. Whether it be through prayer, fasting, reading a daily devotional, giving to or serving others, random acts of kindness or volunteering, you just may find by writing it down—and creating paper art in the process—your Lenten observance could take on new meaning this year.

Let's do *Lent* together.

LENTEN STEWARDSHIP

Each year as we enter the season of Lent, the tradition is to fast, give something up. Some people give up eating meat, or having caffeine drinks or alcohol. The idea of self-sacrifice is meant to help people notice something more important than food, or drink. *We remember that Jesus went to the wilderness for forty days without eating.*

But, there is another way to honor Lent—you could ADD something. Add in taking time to study God's word. Do some exercises while praying. Cook something and give it away. Make a card or write a letter and send it to someone who needs to hear from you. Watch a really inspiring movie or listen to wonderful music. Take time to rest. You have been given many gifts. **During Lent you can give something up or take something on.**

Which ever you choose, may it bring you closer to God.

TRINITY 2023 | WORKING TOGETHER IN MINISTRY

At Trinity's Annual Meeting in January, approval was given for a 2023 ministry budget supporting worship, building up congregation activities, outreach actions, and staff and building needs with an income estimate resulting in a potential \$60,000 deficit. Last year, as COVID lost some of its grip, we were able to return to a fuller ministry program and a 2022 budget with a potential \$50,000 deficit. And it happened. But thanks to fewer expenses, a \$25,000 contingency fund, and a healthy starting balance at the onset of last year, we ended the year almost even. Fulfilling our 2023 ministry budget will require more a bit more effort from the entire congregation because costs are up and some of the reserve we were blessed with in the past is gone. The Finance Team will make every effort to keep you aware of how we are doing as we go through the year. I look forward to how we will be sharing the love and promise of God in 2023 and also in sharing some of what God has financially given us to fulfill our ministry plan.

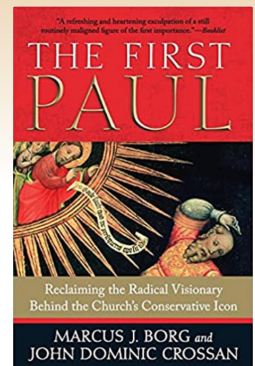

The First Paul by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan

**BOOK STUDY DISCUSSION
TUESDAY, MARCH 28 | 6:30 PM**

Crossan and Borg—two of the world's top-selling Christian scholars and the bestselling authors of *The Last Week* and *The First Christmas*—once again shake up the status quo by arguing that the message of the apostle Paul, considered by many to be the second most important figure in Christianity, has been domesticated by the church. Borg and Crossan turn the common perception of Paul on its head, revealing him as a radical follower of Jesus whose core message is still relevant today.
