# CALL TO WORSHIP:

#### PRAISE SONG: "Dream God's Dream" (vs. 1 & 2) (music at end of bulletin)

#### THE CONFESSION:

Leader: Let us be honest with God, with each other and with ourselves about the state of our lives.

- People: O God, we confess to you that your passion for justice has not been our own. We talk about justice and demand it when we feel that we have been wronged, but we fail to see the brutality exacted on others. We fume over the driver who cuts us off in traffic but ignore the mentally ill who roam our streets without proper health care. We complain about our neighbor's music being too loud while innocent lives are being lost daily in wars around the world. We think we have been ill-used because the price of gasoline for our vehicle is so high while multitudes walk wherever they need to go. Forgive us for our self-centered ways. Open our eyes to the suffering around us and give us the power of your Spirit to confront injustice and evil wherever we find them. Amen.
- Leader: The God of justice is also the God of compassion. God forgives your sins and commissions you as a minister of justice.

#### CONFESSION RESPONSE: "We Have Seen the Messiah (v. 3) (music at end of bulletin)

#### THE LESSON:

#### Amos 5:21-24

This Old Testament prophet, or spokesperson for God, has a message of condemnation and possibility. Here Amos condemns their religious practices and God's non-acceptance of them. Instead he suggests God desires actions of fairness or justice to others and also personal right harmonious living or righteousness.

I hate, I despise your festivals,

and I take no delight in your solemn assemblies.

Even though you offer me your burnt-offerings and grain-offerings,

I will not accept them;

and the offerings of well-being of your fatted animals

I will not look upon.

Take away from me the noise of your songs;

I will not listen to the melody of your harps.

But let justice roll down like waters,

and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

## THE GOSPEL:

### Matthew 25:31-46

As Matthew tells the story of Jesus' life, this takes place in Jerusalem on the Mt. of Olives after the disciples asked Jesus about last or end things. He tells three stories and this is the final one, sometimes called the Judgement of the Nations or the Last Judgement.

'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on the throne of his glory. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats, and he will put the sheep at his right hand and the goats at the left. Then the king will say to those at his right hand, "Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?" And the king will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." Then he will say to those at his left hand, "You that are accursed, depart from me into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." Then they also will answer, "Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or sick or in prison, and did not take care of you?" Then he will answer them, "Truly I tell you, just as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me." And these will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.<sup>2</sup>


## THE SENDING OUT:

Leader: Go in peace. Serve the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.** 




