THE CONFESSION:

Leader: When you molded creation in the beginning, God of righteousness, you named all that you made "good." Yet we have chosen repeatedly to see your world and others in it and call them "bad," "less than," "not good enough." We have not realized the depths of your love for us and so we have tried to keep you to ourselves instead of sharing the gifts that are yours.

Leader: We have let others go hungry.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have let people sleep under bridges and in their cars.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have suggested that health is a luxury rather than a basic human right.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have taken the resources of the land as though tomorrow and our children don't matter.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have waged wars when others didn't see things our way or when we wanted their land.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have traumatized soldiers by asking them to do unthinkable things.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have not listened to those brutalized by others who have power over them.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have not carried out our responsibilities as citizens to work for the good of all persons.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have walked away or shut out persons we deemed different from ourselves.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have not spoken up in situations where racism and where exclusion because of gender or sexual identity, or cognitive distinctiveness or physical difference were rampant.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have not been quiet and listened as someone tried to explain their feelings to us.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: We have not encouraged all persons to reach their fullest potential as your children.

All: Forgive us.

Leader: O God, this list makes us ill and we know it only touches the surface of our brokenness. It seems that we have taken your good creation and made it a mess. Yet you appear repeatedly with reminders of forgiveness, mercy, and grace. Even as we consider all the wrongs in the world, you call us again to work with you to right these wrongs- to share our food, to provide shelter and health care, to mediation and reconciliation, to listen and to speaking up. Yet it is clear, God of justice, that none of this brokenness can be mended without our acceptance of your forgiveness and fresh start. Redirect our energies and our actions. We give ourselves to you for healing and sending. In the name of Jesus

THE LESSONS: Genesis 24:34–38, 42–49, 58–67

This is from the first book of the Bible and the Old Testament with stories of creation and also of the beginning of God's chosen people, the Israelites This story is about the servant of Abraham, the first patriarch, being sent to Abraham's home country to select a wife for Abraham's son, Isaac, and how the servant acknowledges the role of God in that process when Rebekah became the chosen one.

34 So he said, 'I am Abraham's servant. ³⁵The LORD has greatly blessed my master, and he has become wealthy; he has given him flocks and herds, silver and gold, male and female slaves, camels and donkeys. ³⁶And Sarah my master's wife bore a son to my master when she was old; and he has given him all that he has. ³⁷My master made me swear, saying, "You shall not take a wife for my son from the daughters of the Canaanites, in whose land I live; ³⁸but you shall go to my father's house, to my kindred, and get a wife for my son."

42 'I came today to the spring, and said, "O LORD, the God of my master Abraham, if now you will only make successful the way I am going! ⁴³I am standing here by the spring of water; let the young woman who comes out to draw, to whom I shall say, 'Please give me a little water from your jar to drink,' ⁴⁴and who will say to me, 'Drink, and I will draw for your camels also'—let her be the woman whom the LORD has appointed for my master's son."

45 'Before I had finished speaking in my heart, there was Rebekah coming out with her water-jar on her shoulder; and she went down to the spring, and drew. I said to her, "Please let me drink." ⁴⁶She quickly let down her jar from her shoulder, and said, "Drink, and I will also water your camels." So I drank, and she also watered the camels. ⁴⁷Then I asked her, "Whose daughter are you?" She said, "The daughter of Bethuel, Nahor's son, whom Milcah bore to him." So I put the ring on her nose, and the bracelets on her arms. ⁴⁸Then I bowed my head and worshipped the LORD, and blessed the LORD, the God of my master Abraham, who had led me by the right way to obtain the daughter of my master's kinsman for his son. ⁴⁹Now then, if you will deal loyally and truly with my master, tell me; and if not, tell me, so that I may turn either to the right hand or to the left.'

⁵⁸And they called Rebekah, and said to her, 'Will you go with this man?' She said, 'I will.' ⁵⁹So they sent away their sister Rebekah and her nurse along with Abraham's servant and his men. ⁶⁰And they blessed Rebekah and said to her,

'May you, our sister, become

thousands of myriads;

may your offspring gain possession

of the gates of their foes.'

⁶¹Then Rebekah and her maids rose up, mounted the camels, and followed the man; thus the servant took Rebekah, and went his way.

62 Now Isaac had come from Beer-lahai-roi, and was settled in the Negeb. ⁶³Isaac went out in the evening to walk in the field; and looking up, he saw camels coming. ⁶⁴And Rebekah looked up, and when she saw Isaac, she slipped quickly from the camel, ⁶⁵and said to the servant, 'Who is the man over there, walking in the field to meet us?' The servant said, 'It is my master.' So she took her veil and covered herself. ⁶⁶And the servant told Isaac all the things that he had done. ⁶⁷Then Isaac brought her into his

mother Sarah's tent. He took Rebekah, and she became his wife; and he loved her. So Isaac was comforted after his mother's death.

Romans 7:15-25a

The Apostle Paul writing to the Christian believers in Rome laments about his dilemma, and maybe that of every human, namely, not being able to exhibit the behavior he and us may want sometimes. He uses the word "law" as if it is a life principle, but his final words may suggest that thanks to Jesus he, like us, is still accepted and loved.

I do not understand my own actions. For I do not do what I want, but I do the very thing I hate. Now if I do what I do not want, I agree that the law is good. But in fact it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me. For I know that nothing good dwells within me, that is, in my flesh. I can will what is right, but I cannot do it. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do. Now if I do what I do not want, it is no longer I that do it, but sin that dwells within me.

So I find it to be a law that when I want to do what is good, evil lies close at hand. For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!

THE GOSPEL: *Matthew* 11:16–19, 25–30

These words of Jesus suggest surprise at the reaction of many to what His ministry has been. He expresses some of this to His heavenly Father and includes what He has really come to do. Finally, Jesus still invites all to find comfort and strength for their lives through Him.

'But to what will I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to one another,

"We played the flute for you, and you did not dance;

we wailed, and you did not mourn."

For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, "He has a demon"; the Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, "Look, a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax-collectors and sinners!" Yet wisdom is vindicated by her deeds."

At that time Jesus said, 'I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and the intelligent and have revealed them to infants; yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. All things have been handed over to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

'Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.'


