The Church begins the month of November celebrating All Saints. We take time to stop and remember all those who have gone before—who have showed us what it means to live with love, faith, and perseverance. We remember what a gift these people have been in our lives and take comfort knowing they are now safe in the kingdom of God. They are the saints triumphant.

At the same time we remember that in thanksgiving we are called to continue their legacy. We are called to be people of faith who touch the world with love and hope in all we do.

We take time, as the proclamation of thanksgiving says, to: unite in rendering unto God our sincere and humble thanks—for God's kind care and protection. In December we celebrate what we Christians consider the greatest gift of all—the birth of Jesus Christ, God's own son. We celebrate the birth of Jesus always with an eye to the truth that this gift comes to fullness in the death of Jesus on the cross. The observation of Christmas calls forth in all people in some ways a new gentleness, generosity, and peace. It calls us as Christians to offer gifts, not just to friends and family but to our Lord. A child's song says: What can I give him as poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would give a lamb; If I were a wise one, I would do my part; Yet what can I give him: ... I give my heart.

In all these cases, this month and next, let us remember that true thanksgiving is in thanks-living. May all that we are in our everday lives be a reflection of our thankfulness to the one who never stops giving us the gifts of love and grace.

## End of Season Monarch Ministry News

I am excited to report that over 200 Monarch Butterflies were raised and released by Trinity this year. At Blue Lotus Center during a Bio Blitz event with staff from Urban Ecology, I learned how to tag a monarch butterfly. Special numbered tiny stickers are applied to the migrating monarchs discal cell of the wing. Each sticker has a tag code, so if the butterfly is found, researchers are able to track its journey. Our final monarch tagging took place on September 28th in Trinity's fountain garden and we invited the YMCA children to join in the FUN!

We have MILKWEED SEEDS available for planting before winter. Pick up a packet while supplies last!



## NOVEMBER BOOK STUDY WITH PASTOR DAVE TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 28 | 7 PM

During November, you are invited to read the book, Human (Kind) by Ashlee Eiland.

HERE IS AMAZON'S BRIEF DESCRIPTION: Long before polls, protests, and political issues divided us, we were joined by a humanness that God considered very good. Created in his image, we reflected the height and depth of God's loving-kindness, but our discord has blinded us to the imago Dei in us all.

In this compelling collection of essays, Ashlee Eiland shares her story of being a black woman living on two sides of the fence: as the token black girl in majority-white spaces and as the "whitewashed" black girl in majority-black spaces. As she discovers her own unique worth through these recollections, Ashlee learns that extending radical kindness toward every person—regardless of social status, political views, or religious beliefs—gives us hope and rekindles our common humanity.

With grace and humility, Human(Kind) invites us to chart our own formative journeys and recognize our inherent value, cultivating empathy so we may once again see the image of God shining brightly within one another. You are invited to gather and discuss this book on Tuesday November 28th at 7:00. All are welcome.
