CALL TO WORSHIP:

THE CONFESSION:

CONFESSION RESPONSE: I Come to the Cross (music at end of bulletin)

THE LESSON: 2 Corinthians 4:3-6 (The Message)

Writing a second letter to the young and challenged group of believers in Corinth, Greece, the Apostle Paul strongly states what he believes is happening among them and how they may find a new focus.

If our Message is obscure to anyone, it's not because we're holding back in any way. No, it's because these other people are looking or going the wrong way and refuse to give it serious attention. All they have eyes for is the fashionable god of darkness. They think he can give them what they want, and that they won't have to bother believing a Truth they can't see. They're stone-blind to the dayspring brightness of the Message that shines with Christ, who gives us the best picture of God we'll ever get.

Remember, our Message is not about ourselves; we're proclaiming Jesus Christ, the Master. All we are is messengers, errand runners from Jesus for you. It started when God said, "Light up the darkness!" and our lives filled up with light as we saw and understood God in the face of Christ, all bright and beautiful.

THE GOSPEL:

Mark 9:2-9

This story is called the Transfiguration of Jesus where His appearance is changed and the disciples with Him want to make the experience last longer. The New Testament books of Matthew and Luke also have this story before Jesus begins His final journey to Jerusalem where ultimately He dies and is resurrected. This transfiguration story is often read on the Sunday before the start of Lent, a season when Christians often consider the events in Jesus life related to His last days in Jerusalem.

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and John, and led them up a high mountain apart, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no one on earth could bleach them. And there appeared to them Elijah with Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Rabbi, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.' He did not know what to say, for they were terrified. Then a cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud there came a voice, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him!' Suddenly when they looked around, they saw no one with them anymore, but only Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, he ordered them to tell no one about what they had seen, until after the Son of Man had risen from the dead.

THE SENDING OUT:


