THE CONFESSION:

All: Christ Jesus, you taught your followers to form community and to share all that they had with those in need. In such a way, you provided for everyone. We have assurance that you walk with us during times of trouble, you provide all good things; yet we often horde what we have for fear that we will not have plenty. Our cups overflow in many ways, goodness and mercy have followed us; yet, we often horde our own mercy toward others. We try to thrive even though we are disconnected and alone.

Teach us to share in common those gifts you have given us material, emotional and spiritual. Forgive us when we lose sight of the call to bring all people into the place of plenty and thanksgiving. May the Scriptures and our prayers transform our hearts every day, so that we keep the vision of all people connected in you.

We take time now to confess to you how disconnected we have become from you and one another:

Leader: We are assured of your bountiful forgiveness, and we humbly thank you as you lead us on right paths. Amen.

THE READING: 1 John 4:7-21 (The Message)

Here is an affirmation about God's love and that it is meant to be reflected to others within an early Christian community. It emphasizes that to claim God as love and not share it with others is inconsistent.

My beloved friends, let us continue to love each other since love comes from God. Everyone who loves is born of God and experiences a relationship with God. The person who refuses to love doesn't know the first thing about God, because God *is* love—so you can't know God if you don't love. This is how God showed God's love for us: God sent God's only Son into the world so we might live through him. This is the kind of love we are talking about—not that we once upon a time loved God, but that God loved us and sent God's Son as a sacrifice to clear away our sins and the damage they've done to our relationship with God.

My dear, dear friends, if God loved us like this, we certainly ought to love each other. No one has seen God, ever. But if we love one another, God dwells deeply within us, and God's love becomes complete in us—perfect love!

This is how we know we're living steadily and deeply in God, and God in us: God's given us life from God's life, from God's very own Spirit. Also, we've seen for ourselves and continue to state openly that the Father sent God's Son as Savior of the world. Everyone who confesses that Jesus is God's Son participates continuously in an intimate relationship with God. We know it so well, we've embraced it heart and soul, this love that comes from God.

God is love. When we take up permanent residence in a life of love, we live in God and God lives in us. This way, love has the run of the house, becomes at home and mature in us, so that we're free of worry on Judgment Day—our standing in the world is identical with Christ's. There is no room in love for fear. Well-formed love banishes fear. Since fear is crippling, a fearful life—fear of death, fear of judgment—is one not yet fully formed in love.

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We, though, are going to love—love and be loved. First we were loved, now we love. God loved us first.

If anyone boasts, "I love God," and goes right on hating their sibling, thinking nothing of it, they are a liar. If they won't love the person they can see, how can they love the God they can't see? The command we have from Christ is blunt: Loving God includes loving people. You've got to love both.though, are going to love—love and be loved. First we were loved, now we love. God loved us first.

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THE GOSPEL: John 15:1-8 (The Message)

These are words of Jesus shared with His disciples while in Jerusalem before His death. He speaks of Himself as a vine with branches, or followers, and His Father as the farmer who cares for the vine so it produces fruit. As Jesus' disciples were meant to produce fruit, it might be said that we, who are His followers today, are meant to do the same.

"I am the Real Vine and my Father is the Farmer. He cuts off every branch of me that doesn't bear grapes. And every branch that is grape-bearing he prunes back so it will bear even more. You are already pruned back by the message I have spoken.

"Live in me. Make your home in me just as I do in you. In the same way that a branch can't bear grapes by itself but only by being joined to the vine, you can't bear fruit unless you are joined with me.

"I am the Vine, you are the branches. When you're joined with me and I with you, the relation intimate and organic, the harvest is sure to be abundant. Separated, you can't produce a thing. Anyone who separates from me is deadwood, gathered up and thrown on the bonfire. But if you make yourselves at home with me and my words are at home in you, you can be sure that whatever you ask will be listened to and acted upon. This is how my Father shows who he is—when you produce grapes, when you mature as my disciples.


