
L2: For the times we are afraid to follow you.

## THE LESSON Psalm 139:7-16

The Old Testament book of Psalms describes feelings humans have about God as another being. These translated verses, from one of the 150 Psalms, is done by Eugene Peterson (THE MESSAGE), suggest God is not distant or far away but present and intimate.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: this cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. With thanksgiving we take this bread and this cup and proclaim the mystery of faith.

# C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

L1: Pour out your Holy Spirit upon us that this meal may be a communion of the body and blood of our Lord. Make us one with Christ and with all who share this feast. Unite us in faith; encourage us in hope; inspire us to love, that we may serve as your faithful disciples until we feast at your table in glory. We praise you, eternal God through Jesus your Word made flesh, in the holy and life-giving Spirit now and forever.
