# IF EVER THERE WAS A MINISTER OF MUSIC . . .

Hazel Griffin has been active in Trinity's music ministry for 33+ years, beginning with accompanying the choirs and then selecting music in collaboration with our many directors of the adult and children's choirs over the years. She was involved in the development of Trinity's Created to Praise worship service in 1997 and since then has continued to grow the music team, inviting new musicians to become valued members of the Trinity family. As Trinity's Music Coordinator, Hazel has a passion for seeking out new music that has both meaningful lyrics to support the weekly message and is also singable by the congregation. As with any coordinator position, there are many behind-the-scenes tasks that keep things running smoothly. These include (but are not limited to) providing the pastors with lists of thematic musical options for the weekly services; managing schedules for cantors, singers and A-V volunteers; coordinating the distribution of the selected weekly music to the singers, organists, and office; creating all of the CTP and alternate tune music for our bulletins, editing recordings of our singers for the online service; scheduling and running rehearsals; and organizing copyright information for reporting compliance with licensing agencies for all music used for in-person and online services.

### Hazel is driven by her deep faith as well as her profound dedication to living a life of service.

Among Hazel's passions and most fulfilling contributions here at Trinity have been the development of **Trinity's Advent Cantatas** and the creation of the **harmenē** ensemble and benefit concerts. For these, she invited and recruited many musicians and singers from the community to join our own talented members. When Covid closed our doors, Hazel and Greg Griffin took on the task of getting an online service up and running, going from zero to online in just 2 weeks and continuing to grow it with new recordings of music over the years since. She created a Virtual Cantata during the pandemic and gathered together a group of "masked singers" to record music we could sing along with and enjoy anytime in the comfort of our homes. In her spare time, Hazel is active with the high schools in West Bend and Slinger, accompanies many students for their solo and ensemble festival entries, and also enjoys playing for community theater productions. Oh, and let's not forget her incredible baking talents as well ... she started the **Trinity Incredible Edibles Bake Sales** as a way to help others by raising money for the Helping Hands Fund. And whenever she signs up to bring treats for coffee hour, you can bet the congregation is going to have one deliciously delectable gathering time after worship! In keeping with her commitment to sharing her gifts through service, Hazel volunteers her baking skills at The Hub in West Bend.

Hazel gave notice of her desire to retire from her position as Music Coordinator here at Trinity more than 2 years ago, but agreed to stay until we could find a replacement. The fact that we (still) have not been able to find such a person is an indicator of just how blessed we have been to have benefited from her gifts in music and organization, her example of service, and her generosity over the past several decades. As of the end of August, however, Hazel has officially retired as Trinity's Music Coordinator. The good news is she will still be part of Trinity, and after a several-week break, she will be back at the keyboard on a regular basis but with more freedom to take time off. She also has indicated that she will return for harmone in the future, when and if everyone's schedules align! For that, and for everything she has brought to Trinity's music ministry, we are extremely thankful, grateful and blessed—beyond words and beyond

In the future, she and Greg are looking forward to more traveling and hiking and to tackling some long-deferred projects at home. Hazel is also happily anticipating saying "yes" to more school and community theater musical opportunities, returning to artistic endeavors, and having a slightly less weedy garden.

For her part, Hazel would like us to know how much she has appreciated Trinity's openness to new and varied musical experiences – it is not like this everywhere! Music can touch a heart in ways that words alone sometimes will not, and the opportunity to be a part of sharing Trinity's message of God's love for all through our music has been a blessing. She would especially like to express her gratitude and appreciation for the talents and time given so freely by our many singers and instrumentalists over the years. Trinity should know that they are blessed to have them as part of our family and as part of our continuing music ministry.


ELCA Youth Gathering Created to Be REFLECTIONS Weekend Worship | Sept 21 & 22








## ANTI-RACISM BOOK STUDY




