Psalm 93:1,2,5

These words of the psalmist emphasize the greatness of God.

- C: you are from all eternity.

## THE GOSPEL (stand)

Matthew 18:33-37

This takes place when the Jewish religious leaders brought Jesus to the Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate, to have Jesus sentenced to death. The exchange of words here between Jesus and Pilate is before the eventual sentence by Pilate of death by crucifixion for Jesus.

Then Pilate entered the headquarters again, summoned Jesus, and asked him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" <sup>34</sup> Jesus answered, "Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?" <sup>35</sup> Pilate replied, "I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed you over to me. What have you done?" <sup>36</sup> Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world. If my kingdom belonged to this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not from here." <sup>37</sup> Pilate asked him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."



### THE LORD'S PRAYER




