
#### LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Voice 1: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined" (Isaiah 9:2).

Voice 2: Today is the second Sunday in Advent. We light today's Advent candle as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, who brought light into the lives of all people.

Voice 1: (*lights second candle*) Jesus said, "I am the light of the world; they who follow me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life."

Voice 2: The gospel of Matthew tells us that when Jesus was born, a beautiful star shone over the location of the child. It was so bright that it gave light and direction to the wise men who came to worship him. And just as the night didn't seem to be so dark anymore, so Jesus' birth itself was to bring hope and new meaning into the world. That new beginning, foretold by the prophets, is the promise that we celebrate this season.

### THE LORD'S PRAYER



## THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE FAMILY MEAL. (Sit)


All who celebrate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to commune today.
