Verse 1:


- L: When the song of your people rings out from each steeple, (C: let this be the time.).

THE READING Isaiah 60:1-3

"Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you. ² See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the LORD rises upon you and his glory appears over you. ³ Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.

THE GOSPEL Matthew 2:1-12

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem village, Judah territory— this was during Herod's kingship—a band of scholars arrived in Jerusalem from the East. They asked around, "Where can we find and pay homage to the newborn King of the Jews? We observed a star in the eastern sky that signaled his birth. We're on pilgrimage to worship him." ³⁻⁴ When word of their inquiry got to Herod, he was terrified—and not Herod alone, but most of Jerusalem as well. Herod lost no time. He gathered all the high priests and religion scholars in the city together and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"

5-6 They told him, "Bethlehem, Judah territory. The prophet Micah wrote it plainly:

It's you, Bethlehem, in Judah's land,


no longer bringing up the rear.

From you will come the leader

who will shepherd-rule my people, my Israel."

⁷⁻⁸ Herod then arranged a secret meeting with the scholars from the East. Pretending to be as devout as they were, he got them to tell him exactly when the birth-announcement star appeared. Then he told them the prophecy about Bethlehem, and said, "Go find this child. Leave no stone unturned. As soon as you find him, send word and I'll join you at once in your worship."⁹⁻¹⁰ Instructed by the king, they set off. Then the star appeared again, the same star they had seen in the eastern skies. It led them on until it hovered over the place of the child. They could hardly contain themselves: They were in the right place! They had arrived at the right time!

¹¹ They entered the house and saw the child in the arms of Mary, his mother. Overcome, they kneeled and worshiped him. Then they opened their luggage and presented gifts: gold, frankincense, myrrh. ¹² In a dream, they were warned not to report back to Herod. So they worked out another route, left the territory without being seen, and returned to their own country.

and called us your own.

All: We come to be strengthened, reshaped, and made new to shine

with your light.

Leader: In this family meal we celebrate the gift of God in Christ Jesus.

All: In sharing of the bread and wine we find forgiveness of sin and

God's resurrection presence.

Leader: God gives us this gift to share.

All: We come to eat and drink and to be changed.

Leader: Our Lord, Jesus, on the night of his betrayal, in a quiet room with his

disciples, took bread and gave thanks. When he had blessed it, he broke it and gave it to his disciples saying, "Take, eat, this is my body given for you. Do this to remember me." And then he took a cup and when he had given thanks he gave it for all to drink saying, "Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for you and for all people for the

forgiveness of sins. Do this to remember me"

All: Jesus, let your body and blood flow through us to remold us and

renew us with your presence.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Be confident of your release, Be encouraged in your growth,


