

L: When we are tempted to think of our immediate needs and turn our back on others, Jesus draws us back to reality.


P: All we truly need is you, O Christ.

THE GOSPEL READING

Mark 11:12-18 and 12:41-44

As Mark tells the story of Jesus' life, both these incidents take place in the most important Jewish place of worship in Jesus' day, the Temple in Jerusalem. In the first Jesus reacts to the overcharging of money changers for temple animal sacrifice by overturning their tables. In the second He notices the contribution of the temple offering by a widow.

Then they came to Jerusalem. And he entered the temple and began to drive out those who were selling and those who were buying in the temple, and he overturned the tables of the money-changers and the seats of those who sold doves; and he would not allow anyone to carry anything through the temple. He was teaching and saying, 'Is it not written,

"My house shall be called a house of prayer for all the nations"? But you have made it a den of robbers.'

And when the chief priests and the scribes heard it, they kept looking for a way to kill him; for they were afraid of him, because the whole crowd was spellbound by his teaching. And when evening came, Jesus and his disciples* went out of the city.

He sat down opposite the treasury and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'

All who celebrate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to commune today.


When you receive the bread, you may either dip the wafer in the first chalice of wine or the second chalice of grape juice Please indicate to the pastor if you need a gluten free wafer.
