People: We stand here today, not to be swayed by the winds of opinion, but to stand firm in the truth of our faith.


Leader: Let us draw upon that strength, that courage, and that unwavering faith, and let us worship God.


CHILDREN'S MESSAGE (sit)

THE EXTINGUISHING OF THE LENTEN CANDLE AND THE LENTEN SNAPSHOT - A Voice in the Crowd

As Mark tells his story of the life of Jesus, this is an event near the end of his book, taking place during the Jewish festival of Passover, which leads to Jesus death and resurrection. It is Jesus' appearance before the Roman governor, Pilate, which includes the verbal exchanges between Pilate, the Jewish chief priests, and the crowd, resulting in Jesus' sentence of death by crucifixion.

Now at the festival he used to release a prisoner for them, anyone for whom they asked. Now a man called Barabbas was in prison with the rebels who had committed murder during the insurrection. So the crowd came and began to ask Pilate to do for them according to his custom. Then he answered them, 'Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?' For he realized that it was out of jealousy that the chief priests had handed him over. But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release Barabbas for them instead. Pilate spoke to them again, 'Then what do you wish me to do* with the man you call* the King of the Jews?' They shouted back, 'Crucify him!' Pilate asked them, 'Why, what evil has he done?' But they shouted all the more, 'Crucify him!' So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas for them; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified.
