"To be a Christian means to forgive the inexcusable because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you." ~C.S. Lewis


"Forgiveness is an act of the will, and the will can function regardless of the temperature of the heart." ~Corrie Ten Boom

THE EXTINGUISHING OF THE LENTEN CANDLE AND THE LENTEN SNAPSHOT - Barabbas

32 Two others, both criminals, were taken along with him for execution.

33 When they got to the place called Skull Hill, they crucified him, along with the criminals, one on his right, the other on his left.



follow the way of Jesus.

Leader: In the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread and gave thanks.

He broke it, and shared it with disciples saying, "Take and eat. This is my body given for you." Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink saying: "This is my blood shed for you and for all people. It promises forgiveness and a new life. It is the sign of the new

covenant between us. Drink this to remember me."

All: This is the new relationship we share together.

All who celebrate Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior are invited to commune today.


When you receive the bread, you may either dip the wafer in the first chalice of wine or the second chalice of grape juice Please indicate to the pastor if you need a gluten free wafer.

(We also have individually packaged gluten free wafer/wine.)










