Matthew 21:1-11

¹When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, ²saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. ³If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." ⁴this took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, ⁵"Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey." ⁶The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; 7they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. [®]A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. [®]The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! C: Hosanna. Save us. Save us now.


Confession Prayer


I raise my hand in solemn oath; I say, 'I'm always around. By that very life I promise:

Psalm 31:9-16

- L: Be gracious to me, O LORD, for I am in distress; my eye wastes away from grief, my soul and body also.
- C: For my life is spent with sorrow, and my years with sighing; my strength fails because of my misery, and my bones waste away.
- L: I am the scorn of all my adversaries, a horror to my neighbors, an object of dread to my acquaintances; those who see me in the street flee from me.
- C: I have passed out of mind like one who is dead; I have become like a broken vessel.
- L: For I hear the whispering of many-- terror all around!-- as they scheme together against me, as they plot to take my life.
- C: But I trust in you, O LORD; I say, "You are my God."
- L: My times are in your hand; deliver me from the hand of my enemies and persecutors.

Think of yourselves the way Christ Jesus thought of himself. He had equal status with God but didn't think so much of himself that he had to cling to the advantages of that status no matter what. Not at all. When the time came, he set aside the privileges of deity and took on the status of a slave, became human! Having become human, he stayed human. It was an incredibly humbling process. He didn't claim special privileges. Instead, he lived a selfless, obedient life and then died a selfless, obedient death—and the worst kind of death at that—a crucifixion.

Because of that obedience, God lifted him high and honored him far beyond anyone or anything, ever, so that all created beings in heaven and on earth—even those long ago dead and buried—will bow in worship before this Jesus Christ, and call out in praise that he is the Master of all, to the glorious honor of God the Father.
