CHRIST IS RISEN! CHRIST IS RISEN INDEED!

We cling to this good news as one of the centers of our faith!—but, take a deep breath and look around, we are living in tumultuous times. The winds of change and division are deep and strong. Truth is being twisted and faith is being tested and questioned. **The world isn't getting easier for believers.**

The truth is, faith is not built for comfort. It is not something we can put on when it feels comfortable or take off when the pressure rises. Jesus stood before those who mocked, ridiculed and tortured him, but he never wavered. He said to us, **"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."** JOHN 16:33

Faith under fire is either proven or lost. **The cross was the moment of triumph—Jesus overcame the power of sin and the grip of death—all for us.** The trials we face today may well test us, but trials are not meant to break us. Holding the power of God within us, we can walk in the confidence of who we are—*chosen, called and empowered by the spirit of God himself to be disciples of Christ, loving one another as he loves us.* **Stand strong on the victory over the cross. Resist the temptation to "blend in". Don't let the voices of the world be louder than the word and the love of God.**

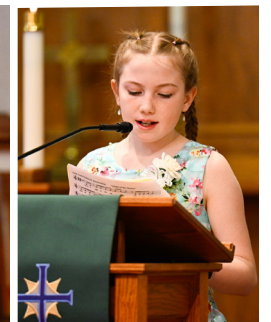

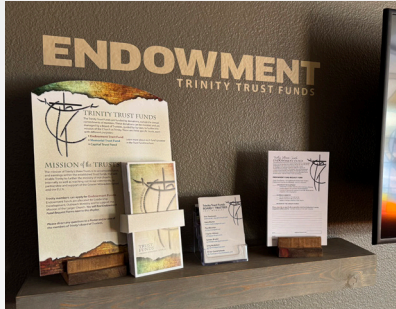
E-X-P-A-N-D-I-N-G MINISTRY IN OUR **NEW LIFE** SEASON

*"What is this?," you may ask. The members of Trinity have the opportunity to expand ministry or service by seeking and providing possibilities and **NEW LIFE** for others through our available Endowment Funds.*

The Endowment Fund exists to promote growth in congregation leaders and to develop new ministry options for the sake of the congregation, the community and the wider Church. Thanks to very generous monetary gifts from members received in the last five years, combined with the Trust Board's decision to invest most of its funds in the Ministry Growth Fund of the ELCA, and good market gains over the past two years, there has been some significant sums of money (over \$40,000) available to help us live our mission of *"Sharing the Love and Promise of God"* by seeking and providing ways of expanding our congregation's ministry and service to others.

There is an Endowment Fund display in our Heritage Room where you will find Trinity Trust Fund brochures, a card with the current Trust Board members, and Endowment Fund Request Forms. *Endowment fund requests can be made in these three different areas:*



1. **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT** which includes scholarships for students attending ELCA institutes of learning, training programs for Trinity staff and church leadership, and purchase of materials for startups of new faith development programs at Trinity.
2. **OUTREACH MINISTRY** which includes service and mission outreach in the greater community, and support also for unique outreach ministries through Trinity
3. **MISSION OF THE LARGER CHURCH** within the Greater Milwaukee Synod, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and their approved ministries.

In February the Trust Board approved an Endowment Fund request submitted by a member for \$2,300 to support the ministry of Breaking the Chains Church—serving the Milwaukee and Kenosha Wisconsin Correctional Centers. Breaking the Chains Church is an approved ministry of our Greater Milwaukee Synod. The Endowment Fund money requested will be used for backpacks given to men when they are released that include gift cards, a bus transit card, a water bottle, a notebook, a Breaking the Chains Church T-shirt, and a few other items useful in their daily lives, plantings to be placed in outside garden areas frequented by the men at both institutions, and also for devotional books, religious calendars, and daily diaries for the men as well. 2025 will be the last year of the 3 year \$3,300 annual Endowment Fund gift to our synod's Equipping the Saints fund raising campaign. *We can say these are ways Trinity shares the love and promise of God through its Endowment Fund.*

April is often considered a "new life month" because the signs of spring become evident and, this year, that includes Easter with its message of Jesus resurrection and victory over death. **Think about how you can help expand Trinity's ministry and provide **NEW LIFE** and possibilities for others through a request of money from the Endowment Fund.**

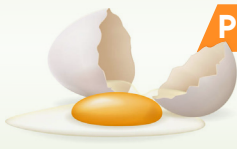

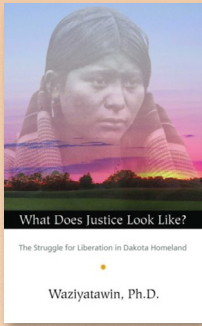

ANTI-RACISM BOOK STUDY

TUESDAY
APRIL 29
7 PM

The next antiracism book study read will be *What Does Justice Look Like? The Struggle for Liberation in Dakota Homeland* by Waziyatawin. It is a study of the Dakota Indians in Minnesota. She speaks bluntly about the painful reality of indigenous people in Minnesota and the deep need for action in light of the atrocities committed by those who took the land. *One reviewer wrote:*

Acknowledging the truth makes a people stronger, not weaker. As a specific example, Waziyatawin compares Fort Snelling's disgraceful "fun fort" self-depiction with the somber reality that imbues other concentration camps and Holocaust memorials. The compelling facts about Fort Snelling include the sacred nature of the land itself, and the fact that it is filled with the marked and unmarked graves of Dakota ancestors, including women who starved themselves to death out of grief, women raped by soldiers, children and elders dead of sicknesses that raged through the fort. Minnesotans also hanged Dakota leaders on that earth. And so when Waziyatawin quite reasonably advocates returning the Fort to the Dakota to do with as they decide, it would seem an act of unquestionable justice. It seems, in fact, a great idea.

Nobody who reads this book will ever drive to the airport again without seeing the devastated woman on the cover—a young woman interred in what became a death camp in the winter of 1862–63. If Fort Snelling was to become a Dakota garden and ceremonial ground, the young woman's thousand-mile stare would at last rest with the living.

This is not an easy read, but it is important for us to hear history through the eyes of the indigenous community. I hope you will take time to read the book and then come and discuss it on Monday, April 29 at 7 PM.

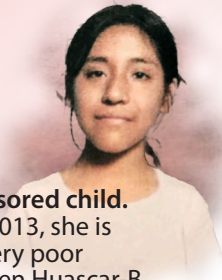

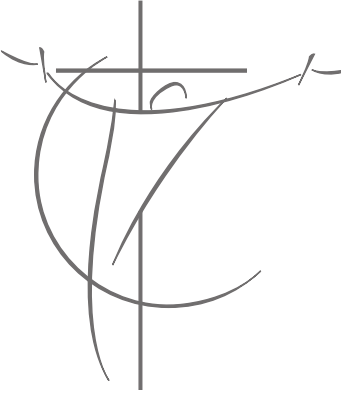
